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## 2014 IHMSA South Central Championships Another Huge Success

It was another successful shoot in Region 4, with the 2014 South Central Championship being held at the Oklahoma City Gun Club on October 3rd-5th. A total of 164 entries shot this 60 round match over the three day period.

This time a year in Oklahoma the weather has cooled down to a level that is comfortable to almost everyone, however the first day of the match was a little on the cool side with temperatures in the low to mid 50's until around noon & it warmed up enough that the long sleeves came off & the shooting warmed up also. Winds, with the exception on Friday, were great for the rest of the match.

Anyone who didn't attend this match missed out on a great three days of shooting steel. Overall, the weather was fantastic! Our target setters did a great job of allowing the match to run smoothly the entire three days to help get those 164 entries through. Thanks guys, you did a great job, the 4-wheelers are a real asset to our club & speed up the match tremendously.

OKC now has auto-reset on the field pistol targets in addition to the Big Bore targets which have worked very well since we installed them over two years ago.

This is 14 years in a row that the Oklahoma City Gun Club has hosted the Region IV match, being centrally located in our six state region makes for reasonable driving distances for most of the Region IV shooters.

As I'm sure you have noticed on the t-shirts as well as the plaques we now

call this match the IHMSA South Central Championships, sorta catchy don't you think? Most shooters liked the name change.

I stayed at the range all three days & enjoyed talking to all the folks after each day's shooting that had brought their RV's; we had a great time, believe me.

Our cook-out Saturday evening was followed by a 60-round AIR match in our weather controlled clubhouse which lasted until about 10 pm. Everyone had a great time at both events, & some good scores were posted. We had several AIR entries but only one perfect 60x60, & four DNF's must have been something in the water.

A total of 23 perfect scores were shot in this match one in AIR; six in Big Bore full-size, two in Half-Scale, eleven in Small Bore, one in PH & two in Fifth-Scale; believe it or not, no 60x60's were shot in the Production & Revolver classes in either Small Bore or Big Bore, WOW, that is unusual.

Those shooting perfect 60x60's are as follows, Jack Tessman, one (1), Woody Liddell, four (4), Sean Murray one (1), Jerry Stringham, one (1), Dave Stone one (1), Wayne Hott, one (1), Scott Thompson, two (2), John Blue one (1), Harry Alder, one (1), Gary Crews, three (3), Ryan Schuff, two (2), & Jim Fields three (3). Great shooting guys.

One of the highlights of the match was one of our junior shooters, Ryan Schuff who won the shoot-off in UAS-Big Bore with a 60x60+3, he also shot a 60x60+7 in UAS-Int. Small Bore. Ryan has only been

shooting our sport a little over a year & has steadily moved up the classification ladder this past six months or so, great shooting Ryan. As most of you know, Ryan is my 13 year-old grandson. This was his first Big Bore perfect score.

Winning one of the top scope classes in a major championship could be a record for that young of a shooter.

Another interesting fact, if Ryan had not have missed one chicken in AIR gun, 59x60, grand-paw & Ryan would have been in a shoot-off for the AIR gun UAS championship, go figure!!

Our 500 meter scope class was won by Steve Martens who shot a 39x40, down the first ram at 500. The 500 meter open sight was won by Woody Liddell with a fine 34x40 which sets a new open sight record on the 500 meter course at our range. Steve holds the 500 meter record with a perfect 40x40 at last years regional as well as repeating a 40x40 at this years Internationals held here at our club in July.

In the Big Bore lever action RIFLE long range category Randy Rahnberg won that one with a 39x60; Don Faulkenberry won both the PC cartridge category 49x60 & the smallbore category, 51x60.

We were fortunate enough to have our IHMSA president's husband, none other than Ken LaCroix attend our match, along with John Richards, his son A. J. & Steve Martens, all from the great state of Minnesota. I think all of them took home some wood.

The most notable of accomplishments was the two 32's shot by Bob Curry in Field Pistol. This may be a range record. Ryan Fields came out of Production AA to take the championship with a 33. Kent Lash got his second leg into UAS-INT with a 40. Rob Dunlap was champion in UFS out of AA class with a fine score of 30. Chris Dunlap took UASFS with one of three 34's, which were decided by shoot-offs.

Trish Ziegler shot a 30 in Field Pistol PAS-AA, her best score yet, which got her a leg up. Danielle Dunlap shot a 39 + 8 in UAS-AA for a leg. One more blasted turkey and she would have been in the championship shoot-off with the male Dunlaps.

In Practical Hunter, Bob Doherty took the PH Short Course championship with a 40 + 10. Fred Hornbaker won the .22 Practical Hunter with a 38.

Rob Dunlap was the UAS champ with a 40 + 8 + 5. Brett Dunlap got a 40 + 8 + 4 and Chris got a 40 + 8 + 3. The youngsters won again!

With a great state championship match now in the books, we hope to see everyone out for our regular match in October.

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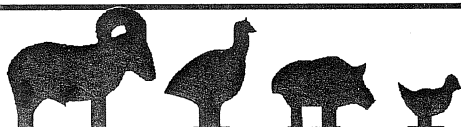

# The New Silhouette

Reloading Habits

Within the last couple of years I've changed my reloading habits. There was a time when I just couldn't stand to have empty brass cases. Just as soon as I fired the last cartridges from a common lot of brass, I would be at my bench stuffing them with primers, powder and bullets. With a free flow of reloading supplies, the only issue was cash flow and thank goodness that has not been a problem for my bench activities. As the component shortage progressed, I became a bit more selective in choosing which cases get loaded and which cases get pushed farther down the queue.

At no point have I been unable to shoot the guns or cartridges that I wish, but I may be loading those cases with components that are available as opposed to what I would typically have on my shopping list. The market is still spotty for components and we all have to make do with what comes down the pike.

When it comes to powders, none of the cartridges suitable for IHMSA matches is what I would call a hog. Due to the generally subdued cartridges that we use, only small to moderate doses of powder are necessary. Even the most robust Big Bore cartridge nibbles gracefully at the powder measure mounted on the reloading bench. Many of the cartridges can make a few pounds of powder go a long way. There is nothing that I shoot in IHMSA that will give me less than a couple thousand loads from an 8 pound keg of powder. At an extreme light load, as for example the classic 2.8 grains of Bullseye for a 38 Special, I can get a whopping 20,000 loads from an 8 pound keg!

For CMP competitions, I sometimes use a .223 Remington cartridge out of a Bushmaster AR. My other choice is the equally ubiquitous 30-06 Springfield cartridge from my M-1 Garand. Obviously, the target grade AR will beat the pants off the Garand for score, but I love to shoot the Garand just as much as the Bushmaster. In fact, this year I've used only the Garand in all my matches to date. Nevertheless, when it comes to reloading, I have to keep in mind that using the same powder(s), the 30-06 Springfield will use about double the volume of the .223 Remington, yielding only approximately 1100 cartridges for an 8 pound keg compared with twice that amount for the smaller cartridge. So, should I dump all that powder into the 30-06 cases or switch to the .223? I'm not sure yet, but I'm thinking about these things which weren't on my radar screen a few years back.

Another area of rethinking for some cartridges is powder density. While there have been times written about the ballistic benefits of using a powder that fills a case to the base of the bullet or even higher and therefore requiring some compression, the benefits have been elusive, at least for me, on many of my straight walled pistol cartridges. With powder plentiful and cheap in the past, there was little downside with just going with the flow (pun intended) and just loading powders that gave full density whether or not it did any good. Now, with scarcity and premium pricing, why not use a faster few grains floating around in a case if the results are comparable? This approach will not work in every case or circumstance but when it does, there's no point in paying the price for a density myth. Using only those recipes that safely load to the same velocity using a common bullet, as long as the standard deviation has not been out of line, performance has been pretty much the same using faster powders. One caveat would be that additional care must be taken to keep the powder throws consistent. While reloading always requires the requisite care to do it safely, even within safety bounds sloppy measuring of powder will give sloppy results. That 1/10th grain difference is magnified when there are only a few grains being thrown. The effects of a 1/10th grain difference in a slower powder that goes up to the base

of the bullet or may even have to be compressed is much less discernible, if at all.

Using a powder measure, I check the charge weights of faster powders more frequently and keep the powder measure pretty full. One advantage of faster powders is that the powder measure stays full longer due to the small charge weights being deducted. As always, I try to be consistent in the cadence of my throws, waiting just long enough for the powder to actually leave the powder measure and enter the case.

Another caution with small charge weights is to be careful of double or even more multiple charges. One advantage of slower powders that completely or nearly completely fill the whole case is that they are impossible to double charge. Once the charges of faster powders fall below the half-case capacity level, the possibility of double charges arises and the faster the powder, the greater the possibility. It is important to inspect each case after charging before the bullet is seated. Even with small charges of a few grains, doubling should be apparent as each case is carefully visually inspected. If there is ever a doubt, toss the contents back into the hopper and recharge the case.

To be sure, faster powders are not always ideal. In the bottleneck rifle cartridges that I use, recommended loads have always seemed to fill the case pretty much. On the other hand, I still find it hard to beat a few grains of Bullseye in a 38 Special target load. While old habits are hard to kick, as I go to the reloading bench, I keep my options open and consider alternatives, always keeping safety in mind.

I just got back from a Mini Palma non-match. Based on the previous evenings' weather forecast, I knew it was likely the match would not run and while I was brewing the morning coffee, the heavy downpour reinforced my feeling. Nevertheless, I had a couple of hours already set aside so I judiciously grabbed a couple of lonely back of the safe pistols and some plinking ammo. Not to my surprise, the Mini Palma match was canceled, but the rain had subsided sufficiently to make going downrange for target setup and change an affair that did not require scuba equipment. It is indeed nice to return to one of my all time favorite shoots, just a relaxing couple of hours with no formality, no range commands, nothing but casually sending bullets downrange with a couple of old favorite firearms that hardly see the light of day since they are not competition quality. When I think of all the various structured

events that come and go in the shooting world, plinking still hangs in there and will always be a favorite of mine and I would estimate, millions of other shooters. Even where it is not the number one shooting pastime, it is probably number two for just about everyone. On a national basis, that probably makes it the leader, since so many people have a different number one but everyone has the same number two. By sheer count, number two becomes the leader overall.

While there are many youthful things that cannot be revisited, plinking stands out as an enduring activity that transcends all age groups. For me, each time has that same exhilaration as the first time, an at-

tribute that applies to so few things these days. It just makes me yearn for more rainy days when scheduled shoots are canceled.

As I write this, we're entering hunting season with big game still about a month distant. That means I'll be doing my annual sight-in duty, looking forward to the perennial migration that includes those returning just to check their zeros and new shooters with new guns as well as everything in between those extremes. I will be sure to share some anecdotes with you in the January/February issue. Meanwhile, I wish everyone the best during this Holiday Season and for all of you to enjoy a Healthy and Prosperous New Year.

## The Ginny West Memorial

2014 Louisiana Smallbore, Fifth-Scale, Field Pistol Championship

Another season is in the history book for Ascension Silhouette as we hosted the Ginny West Memorial Championship on October 4th & 5th. And what a match it was! We had the highest turnout that I have seen in many years, as shooters from five different states (Louisiana, Alabama, Mississippi, Florida, and Washington) were on hand to shoot a total of 46 entries.

Steve Mooney got the nod for farthest travel, having made the drive from the state of Washington. Steve fired two Field Pistol entries and showed us all how it's done. He finished with a 63 aggregate score based on a Production 26X40 and Production Any Sight 37X40. This is the first opportunity I have had to share the range with Steve and I must say it was a pleasant experience. I hope he enjoyed himself as much as we enjoyed having him with us.

Richard Slaton came down from Alabama and had a great match as well. He shared with me the fact that he had posted two personal best high scores here and in addition made the 100 club with a 101X120. Region Two Director Allen Gasikin from Mississippi attended and fired some decent scores. In fact, I loaned Allen my Anschutz Unlimited gun and he almost beat me... with my own gun. We both managed a 39X40 with that Anschutz.

The largest contingent of out of state shooters came from Florida in the persons

of Wayne Smith, Harry Stover, Steve Broxson, Ernie Schluter, and Dave Nuetzel. This group always brings a lot of strength in the Standing categories as the scores below will attest. Notably, Wayne Smith fired a Field Pistol Aggregate of 64X120 and Harry Stover had a 37X40 in PAS. As far as Louisiana residents, Will and Brenda Kirste were here from the far north of our state and the husband and wife team posted identical UAS scores of 37X40. David Heintz drove over two hours one way each day to shoot with us. Also on hand were Robert Stevens and my brother Philip Braud who is the current State Director. Lastly on hand were myself, and Richard West. We also had one Practical Hunter Short Course entry. Philip Braud managed a 40X40 with his 14" Contender 22 Hornet.

Most of the titles were decided outright, the exception was UAS Champion and UASFS Champion which required shoot-offs. My brother Philip and I were involved in each tie breaker. Ten shots at Fifth Scale chickens placed at 100 yards distance was decided upon. My Volquartsen High Standard with 6X scope toppled a fair share of the little critters but I could not keep pace with Philip and his 24X scoped Ruger Charger. Philip bested me in both categories. Several shooters stayed after the match to help pick up the targets and stands (you know who you are). I really appreciate the help. In closing I would again like to extend my sincere thanks to all who attended our match and helped us honor the memory of our dear friend Ginny West.

## Rules Addendum: Practical Hunter

**Class Description:** All 3 classes are to be shot from any SAFE freestyle position including prone, kneeling, sitting, or standing.

The Practical Hunter Long Course will be shot on the 200 meter Big Bore range with the standard full size targets at their normal ranges.

The Practical Hunter Short Course will be shot on the 100 meter Field Pistol range with the standard targets at their normal ranges, using standard field pistol cartridges only.

The Practical Hunter .22LR Course will be shot on the 100 yard SB range with the standard Small Bore targets at their normal ranges.

### Class Rules:

- Any hunting style handgun with

a maximum overall length of 21 inches.

- Optics are allowed up to a maximum of 6x power.
- Gun must be as manufactured with only cosmetic modifications.
- Ported barrels are allowed as long as they are shot from a safe position.
- A rest such as a bipod or a sandbag supporting the barrel in a prone position may be used by a new unclassified shooter and by shooters in classes A and AA.

# What is Bordello?



Bordello offers a practical application of silhouette shooting with your personal defense firearm.

There was a little confusion about Bordello at this year's World Championship, so I decided it might be a good topic to bring forth to our readers. Bordello is not an official class, so just like the 500 meter match I wrote about in the September issue, rules can and may vary from location to location. Knowing very little about it myself, I enlisted the help of a couple of match directors, Tom Funk and Bill Stark, who not only have a lot of knowledge of Bordello, but have what appears to be a good thing going in how they have incorporated Bordello into their monthly matches.

For the basic "rules", here is a synopsis of what I have seen in the places I have seen Bordello shot. Bordello is intended for the use of "carry-type" firearms. With that in mind, the guidelines are pretty basic.

- The course of fire is typically fired on Field Pistol targets at the standard distances (though there can be differences, one of which I will address below).
- Shot from a standing position.
- Barrel length is limited to a maximum of 4 inches for revolvers, and 5 inches for semi-automatics.
- There can be no sight adjustment during the course of fire.

As you might imagine, this makes for a very challenging event. Chickens and pigs aren't too bad with a carry gun, but turkeys and rams can get flat out ridiculous! A quick look at the scores from this year's World Championship will put the challenge of this event into perspective. Shot on Field Pistol targets at the standard distances, Joe Cullison won with a 43x80, shot with a Smith & Wesson revolver in .38 Special. The second place score was a 30x80 fired by Eric King. Anyone who is familiar with these two shooters knows their abilities with handguns. So if you are trying Bordello for the first time, don't get your hopes up with any lofty goals. Just have fun with it and establish your personal baseline, and go from there. It certainly is a good way to get some practice in with your personal self-defense firearm.

\*\*\*

An interesting twist on Bordello that I have seen has been in Colorado, and it has certainly seemed to gain a lot of steam at the local matches there. They have done two things that seem to have piqued interest in Bordello. One is that instead of using the Field Pistol targets, they use Big Bore swinger targets at 25, 50, 75, and 100 yards.

"We have been shooting the Big Bore swingers for the last two years," said Tom Funk. "We made the change because the Field Pistol targets are too hard to hit, and many shooters became discouraged and quit shooting Bordello."

"Using the original Field Pistol targets

was not conducive to getting a large number of shooters interested," added Bill Stark. "The Field Pistol targets are too difficult for inexperienced shooters. Using the larger targets has significantly increased the number of shooters participating."

Using larger targets is the first thing they changed. The second modification was the implementation of a handicap scoring system which levels the playing field for inexperienced shooters.

"In order to give less experienced shooters a fair chance at winning, a handicap system was implemented at the Colorado Rifle Club by match director Tom Funk," reported Stark. "Both raw and handicapped scores are recorded. Raw scores are used to compute the shooter's handicap. During a local match, a shooter's raw score plus their handicap is used in determining class winners for that match. Experience has borne out that the number of shooters are almost evenly divided between revolver and semi-auto classes."

Tom Funk went on to explain the handicap system, which is similar to a golf handicap.

"How it works is we average the last three scores shot by the shooter," detailed Funk. "That average is subtracted from 30 to establish his/her handicap. For example, if a shooter's average scores from the last three matches is 19, then this is subtracted from 30 to establish a handicap of 11. Handicaps are figured after each match and depending on the score shot, are adjusted for the next match. Average scores of 30 or above have a handicap of 0. We have one shooter with a 0 handicap."

"Bordello at Colorado Rifle Club has become very popular and is now drawing as many shooters as all of the .22 categories," continued Funk. "Starting in July of this year, we have established 2 classes—semi-auto's and revolvers. Everything remains the same except there are now twice the winners. Handicaps are figured separately for each class."

With Bordello not being sanctioned by IHMSA as an official class, there was an advantage in that, as Stark pointed out. "We were entirely free to do whatever best suited our community of interest."

\*\*\*

If you haven't shot Bordello yet, or maybe your local range hasn't offered it, hopefully we have provided you with a bit of beneficial information. Since this is not an official class, you may have seen different rules or variations yourself.

One nice thing about Bordello is that while not a great many of the general shooting population may have XP-100's or single-shot handguns that are so common in silhouette shooting, a lot of people have common-type firearms that would be of practical use in the Bordello class. So not only is this just good practice for using

one's personal defense firearm, it might be appealing to a newer shooter to get into silhouette shooting once they are introduced with a gun they already may have on hand.

In addition, match directors can get creative with it, as has been shown in Colorado. For instance, at their state match, a 4" red heart was painted on the ram swinger at 100 yards. The person that

got closest to the center of the heart won a gift certificate. Just another example of how a little creativity helps make for a fun event.

## REQUEST FOR NOMINATIONS

Office of President of IHMSA, Inc.

Article VII, Section 1 of the IHMSA bylaws state the following: "The officers of the corporation shall consist of a President, Vice President, and Secretary/Treasurer. Officers shall be elected every year prior to the annual business meeting held in conjunction with the International Championships. Officers shall assume their official duties following the close of the annual meeting and shall serve for a term of three years or until the election and qualification of their successors. To ensure stability, the term of office of the officers shall be staggered."

Since the current IHMSA President has given their resignation at the end of their term, July, 2015 a call for nominations for the office of IHMSA President is being made.

The IHMSA bylaws state that all nominations must bear the signature and endorsement of the nominee and signatures of two other financial members of the corporation. Also each nominee may provide a statement of claims of not more than 500-words that cites why he/she should be elected to the office for which he/she is being nominated.

Article VII, Section 1 of the IHMSA bylaws describes the "Nominations Officer" whose job it is to receive the nominations for the Executive Officer positions and conduct the election. This officer is appointed annually by the Board. Dell Taylor is again serving this year as the Nominations Officer. For that reason Mr. Taylor's address is listed on the nomination form below and is the person to whom the nominations should be sent.

Candidates for the office of IHMSA President should use the nomination form provided below or a facsimile thereof to declare their candidacy. Guns may be bench rested over any solid rest as long as the gun is not in a Ransom Rest, vise, or any other mechanical clamping device. Lying on your back in freestyle position and piling sandbags by your body for support is legal. This will allow scoped guns set up for creedmoor to better compete.

**The Merit Challenge:**

Centerfire handguns with iron / open sights. Your best 5-shot group at 100 yards or

meters. Groups must be fired from an IHMSA legal freestyle position. No benchrest or artificial support allowed.

**The Daisy Avanti Trophy:**

AIR Production guns with Iron/Open sights. Your best 5-shot group at 18 yards. Groups must be fired from an IHMSA legal freestyle position. No benchrest or artificial support allowed.

**General Rules:** All entries must be shot with IHMSA legal guns. Production, Revolver, and Unlimited guns are allowed in the Burris, Weaver, and Merit classes.

**Witness:** Winning groups must be witnesses by an IHMSA or NRA member. Eligible winning targets must be signed and dated by the shooter and witness. Also, please include the shooter's IHMSA number and the witness's IHMSA or NRA number by their name. A witness is not required to enter but is required to win.

**Targets:** Targets submitted must contain no more and no less than 5 shots in each bull zone.

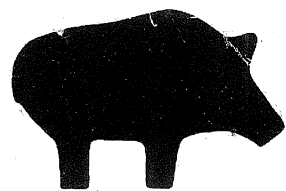

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## Do You Fit The Bill?

Hey all,

The Nov/Dec issue of the *IHMSA News* will be my last. For anyone who knows our personal situation over the past year or so, it is simple to understand that there are higher priority items still to be dealt with, as well as other exciting initiatives and endeavors both personally and professionally which continue to get more involved time-wise as I get further into them.

I notified all regional directors and board members way back in October, so they may already have contacted some of you or even have somebody in place.

I am extremely happy with the work we've gotten done in the past several months to improve the publication, which I hope continues to be built upon. Improvements we've made are things such as:

- getting the *IHMSA News* available online.
- returning the *IHMSA News* to arriving in a timely manner at the beginning of the month (with availability online a few days prior).
- adding another key monthly contributor, Mike Bellm, who is viewed as one of the best in his field and judging from the responses I've gotten since getting Mike on board, this has been a very popular move.
- encouraging articles from the general membership on items of interest, such as we saw in the last couple of issues with a great standing article by Joe Cullison and a well-thought out article by Richard Slaton chronicling his first World Championship experience, and a nice Bordello article in the October issue co-written with Bill Stark and Tom Funk.
- expanding to amount of IHMSA coverage in our monthly publication, getting it back up to 24 pages like it used to be several years ago, and making that a complete informational source, with very little "filler".
- Streamlining some match directors on sending in match reports in proper electronic form--this saves the editor having to retype as many match reports!
- making sure the Front Page, as well as the "Center Fold" were always about PEOPLE & EVENTS--after all, that is what the sport is all about.

When I took this over, I viewed my role as a short-term fix. Lorene had just resigned, and basically if somebody didn't jump on it at that moment, there wasn't going to be an *IHMSA News* heading into that key summer period. I took it over and the deadline for the May issue was just 3 days away--wouldn't wish that on anybody! So basically there were three months to get somebody on board and lined up, as the deadline date for the Jan/Feb issue is January 7th, which I'm sure every region director can think of a few qualified people in their region alone that would fit the bill. Here are a few tidbits an interested person might want to know up front:

- This position is not HARD, but it does take TIME. I'm going to guess that all told, I spend about 15-20 hours a month on it. That includes lots of great email and phone conversations that come up from articles or

people looking for information, and time spent planning, researching, and writing. It probably doesn't have to take as much time as I did, as I did a lot of writing with this that may or may not have been necessary.

- The *IHMSA News* is the primary source of communication IHMSA has with its membership, so it is an integral component to the success of the organization.
- This could be feasibly done by two people, if you had the right two people. Part of the job is the creative part of it (writing stories, talking to people, etc.), and part of it is more of an organizational/clerical aspect (compiling match reports that are sent in, getting items from the monthly contributors, etc.). The first part is the more engaging and interesting part to me; the 2nd part would be well suited for somebody with a little time on their hands that they are willing to donate and who may have some clerical skills.
- The editor's best friend are the folks at Eido Printing. They are great to work with and having been our printers for over 20 years, Donnavée can answer any question you probably have.
- A lot of the work can be spread out over the month (and it is best to do it that way!), but towards the end of the month you obviously get more items in, such as the monthly articles by the various contributors and people just getting things in towards the deadline. Eido wants everything by the 7th of the month, meaning you need to establish your deadline basically as the end of the month that way you have time to organize, proof, compile, and re-edit or re-write things.
- Need to be proficient in Microsoft Word, and that is about it. Maybe know a little about digital cameras, jpegs, etc. You don't have to do the layout or anything like that--Donnavée at Eido does that part, so if you pretty much know basic computer stuff, that is about all it takes.
- The timing is good to start this position in the winter when things are slow. Once May and June hits, it gets busy! In hindsight, I would have benefited greatly from being able to start a few months before I did and getting my feet wet first instead of just having to jump off the high dive!

I will be more than willing to help the new editor with any questions or advice of things I learned that made me more efficient. Nancy LaCroix & Donnavée at Eido were absolute lifesavers to get me going on this, and I certainly would want to help the next person since none of this is really hard, you just have to KNOW certain things to make it easier on yourself. I greatly appreciate being given the opportunity to do this, and as I mentioned above, I think we got a lot of the right work done to make the *IHMSA News* better than it was before. A huge thanks to everybody who has helped make this a great experience for me.

# Major Golden Left the Range

## Major Lee Golden

March 20, 1930-September 13, 2014

Major Lee Golden was born in Seattle Washington on 20 March 1930 into a Navy family, they moved from Seattle to Shreveport, Louisiana in December of 1930 where he grew up. As a young boy he accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior. Major was a member of the Navy Junior ROTC program in which at the age of 16 he went on his first "Float" which was to Panama, where he was able to cross the isthmus of Panama on the Panama Canal. This excursion placed him in hot water at school since he told no one, he was going, and was late for his junior year. Major had an interest in weapons and was a member of the ROTC rifle team from 1945-46.

Major enlisted in the Navy after High School in 1948 at the age of 18, and with his experience on the ROTC Rifle Team he was asked to join the Naval base rifle team in Clarksville Tennessee while stationed at the Special weapons naval base in Clarksville. In 1954 he placed First during an Armed Forces Day Match. While assigned to the USS Vermillion in 1959, and stationed in Norfolk Virginia, he competed again in the Fifth Naval District Rifle and Pistol match and again placed First, this won him the right to compete in the Norfolk Fleet matches in which he took second place and was allowed to compete in all the navy matches. In a competition in San Diego he scored High enough to be allowed to go to the Naval Rifle Team. He began shooting pistol in 1960, and won the Wisconsin Bulls eye Pistol match in 1963 and the Illinois Bulls eye pistol Match in 1964. Major retired from the Navy in 1968 after serving during two wars, the Korean War and Vietnam War, where he served aboard refueling tankers during both conflicts. Major sailed with the navy in the Mediterranean Sea, and has crossed the International Date Line more times that can be counted. Major retired from the Navy in 1968 as a Boatswains Mate First Class turning down Chief or E7 so he could begin a career in the border patrol.

Major served with distinction in the border patrol for 20 years assisting during the Cuban and Haitian immigration crisis. He was also on the Border Patrol Pistol Team and competed as a shooter from 1968 until 1988. In 1979 Major won the Texas Silhouette Pistol Match, in 1984 Major won the Long Range Silhouette Championship in Raton, New Mexico. In 1986 and 1987 Major won the New Mexico Silhouette Pistol matches, and he won the .22 caliber National Championship at Raton, New Mexico in 1987. Major retired from the Border Patrol in 1988.

In 1989 Major and his wife Kathy moved to Tombstone Arizona, he was a member of the Wild Bunch and Kathy was a member of Hells Belles. He played the part of Sheriff Behan at the OK Corral for the next 20 years. During that time he won the 15th Anniversary Silhouette Pistol Match in 1990, and the Arizona Silhouette Pistol Match in 1993. Major has placed seven times in either, first second or third place in World Championship matches. In 1984 he won the NRA National Long Range Silhouette Championship, and the 1997, .22 caliber National Championship. In 2005 Major won the World Championship 3 gun Standing Revolver, with the Ruger .22, 357, and .44 mag, Major again won this same championship match in 2006. Major placed third in the same championship match in 2012 which was his last competitive shoot. Major has to his credit more than 800 trophies, and 200 medals. He was part of the 1/2 percent of distinguished shooters to earn Double Distinguished. He earned distinguished with both the rifle and pistol.

Major was a dedicated Shootist but was also a dedicated Christian, while a member of the First Baptist church unless he was sick or shooting he was in his seat whenever the doors opened and never failed to ask those he met to join him in worshipping his Lord and Savior. He is survived by his wife Kathy, three sons, Dan and Kachi, Larry and Tani, Lance and Angel, 7 grandchildren and 3 great grandchildren.

Major will be missed but his memories and stories will live on for a long time to come. I am better for having known him.

"Dry-firing," was the immediate response from Major Golden. "Lots of practice dry-firing."

The question I had just asked him in this recent phone conversation was, "If you had to give just one piece of advice to help people become better silhouette shooters, what would it be?"

Major went on to add more detail to his answer. "I see people get wrapped up in a lot of the other aspects involved in the sports, all the equipment and reloading and such. But I think sometimes people forget about the most important part—the shooter. The bottom line is it's all about shooting. I think sometimes that gets lost. It's all about shooting."

I had only met Major in person on one occasion—briefly at the 2011 World Championships in Fort Stockton, TX. I was only there for two days, and the interaction I had with Major was nothing more than a couple of friendly hellos in passing.

So to get a phone call from a legend such as Major was certainly a thrill. We ended up probably talking for over an hour

that evening. A few months later, I got the idea for a story that I thought might be of interest to some—I thought it would be interesting to call or email some of the top shooters in our sport, and get their one bit of advice that they would give to shoot-

ers. Ironically, a few days after this idea had popped into my head, the phone rang again. It was Major. He had called to say that he had particularly liked a recent issue of the *IHMSA News*. Once again, we talked for at least an hour. This time, I made a few notes as he talked.

I certainly didn't take enough notes. After our conversation, it got me to thinking about a different article, based on things we had talked about. I figured it would be good article for the winter months, when there isn't much shooting going on. Major told several different stories—some about shooting, some about Tombstone, the OK Corral reenactments, things of that nature.

He talked about the Ruger revolvers he was known for. He acknowledged the quality of Freedom Arms revolvers, but said he never felt the need to go that route because as he stated, "I never had a Ruger that still couldn't shoot a lot better than I could."

I'm certainly glad we got to share a couple of hours on the phone, and greatly appreciated the kind words he had for me on both of those occasions. The article I had in mind involving him obviously now won't be written. Had I known, I would have taken much better notes as I was talking to him that last time.

The thing I will take from him the most though is those simple words he said—"It's all about shooting." Thanks for the great advice, Major.

Regional match notices are limited to 4 3/4"x5". If a club is holding a "specialty" match and that match does not replace one of these championships, the IHMSA News will publish a 2 1/4"x5" notice at no charge one time. These notices will run in Section B only. The club may publish additional notices of the same size for \$45 per issue. Ads must be prepaid before printing. All payments are to be sent to IHMSA HQ, P.O. Box 22356, Cheyenne, WY 82003. The club may specify whether the paid notice is published in Section A or B.

State match results can list both first and second place finishes. Regional match results can list first, second, and third place finishes. "Specialty" matches replacing a state championship may publish first and second place finishes. "Specialty" matches replacing a regional championship may publish first, second, and third place finishes. All other match results wherein the total number of handgun silhouette entries exceeds 11 (including all IHMSA, NRA & non-member guests) can list only the first place finish. Matches with less than 11 total handgun entries as defined above can list all IHMSA handgun entrants and their place. Regardless of the above, all 40's, 60's, and 80's (depending on the number of rounds fired at the match) can be published from ANY IHMSA match.

An IHMSA club holding a dual sanctioned (IHMSA/NRA) match may submit a match report for publication in the IHMSA News containing both IHMSA and NRA results. The number of published NRA results may not exceed the number of published IHMSA results. Publication is limited to IHMSA sanctioned handgun disciplines only.

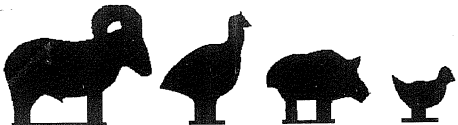

The final pre-production product I received works extremely well, and their newest product, Bore-Whips™ should be on the market by the time you read this.

I am very pleased with the way Bore-Whips™ function. The fit in the bore is very tight, providing complete bore coverage. A significant advantage is cleaning from breech to muzzle and not requiring the use of a bore guide. Also, you can easily trim the cord to any length that fits your needs. Handguns do not need as long a pull cord as rifles obviously. Thus, just cut to fit. You can also use Bore-Whips™ as an open bolt indicator as shown in the photo.

These are easily transportable thus useful to tote in your range bag. Currently they are offered in two caliber specific models, .17 and .22 caliber. If you need both, they are easily identifiable by color code. The .17 caliber Bore-Whips™ have orange cords and the .22 caliber ones are orange.
