SANCTION FEE RULES REMINDER

Per SECTION IX: Match Procedures of the IHMSA Rule Book:

4. Delinquency in remitting sanction fees may affect the designation of 'good standing' of a match. The following policy applies to delinquent remittance of sanction fees:

A) Matches more than 30 days delinquent (60 days after the date of the match) shall not be eligible to send delegates to the annual business meeting.

B) After 90 days delinquency (120 days after the date of the match), the matter will be brought up for review of sanction revocation by the Executive Committee

5. Any organization hosting sanctioned matches that fails to adhere to IHMSA rules may have their sanction withdrawn by the Executive Committee. In the event of sanction being withdrawn, the affected organization shall, upon written request to the Secretary/Treasurer, be able to have the decision reviewed by the Board of Directors.

2019 IHMSA WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 2019 IHMSA World Championships held at the Oklahoma City Gun Club on July 12th thru the 20th, was a total success with 632 entries. We averaged 20 relays per day & our wireless auto-reset system kept everything running smoothly & our target painters did a great job as well.

Weather conditions for the first five days were below normal with an average temperature of 89 degrees. However wind conditions for the entire match were on the calm side as the scores below indicate. With a 12 foot apron on the back side of our 403 ft. firing line, spotters & spectators were in the shade from morning into the very late afternoon.

As normal, shooters from as far away as Australia were in attendance & were greeted by our air-conditioned reloading facility 20 yards from the firing line & they took full advantage by reloading many rounds of their favorite calibers to be shot in this match. We certainly appreciate our International shooters for traveling great distances to shoot in our fantastic sport of handgun silhouette competition.

The ULTRA 500 match held on Saturday the 20th had a total of 33 entries, although there were no 40x40's shot but we did have one 39x40 scope shot by John Weaver, John also won the aggregate with a score of 73x80. If you've never participated in the ULTRA 500, you're missing something, dumping a full-size ram at over 1/4 mile away does something for you, believe me, its a great feeling.

Roy Focht of Perkins, Oklahoma in his first ever IHMSA World Championship match, fired five (5), yes, five perfect 80x80 scores, fabulous shooting indeed, congrats Roy.

One of the best, if not the best standing shooter in our sport, Joe Cullison did it again by winning the Iron Man award, fantastic shooting Joe.

Linda Lanning, Atwood, KS, won high lady in BB-UAS & Debbie Tessman also of Kansas won SB-UAS, both with 80x80's, great shooting gals.

Another highlight for our match, we had six (6) junior shooters ranging in age from 9 to 16 who competed in this match & a couple of them shot perfect scores, great shooting guys.

With low wind & excellent lighting conditions all week we had a total of seventy (72) 80x80's plus thirteen (13) 40x40's in AIR competition. WOW!!

Broken down, Big Bore: Revolver (0), Production (0) (that was unusual), Unlimited (4), BB 1/2 scale (6), & BB UAS (12).

In Small Bore: Production (3), Revolver (0), Unlimited (7), UASFS (6), UFS (0), UAS (18), PH Short (5), PH .22 (7), PH Long (2).

The 2020 IHMSA World Championship, for the 7th time in the past 9 years, again will be held here at the Oklahoma City Gun Club, tentative dates are set for July 17th thru the 25th. Make plans to attend that one for sure. Goal for next year is 700 entries.



IHMSA Annual Members' Meeting Minutes

16 July 2019

1. The meeting was called to order @ 7:34 PM by president Steve Martens.
2. With 32 members present, there was a quorum allowing the members to conduct IHMSA business.
3. Mr. Martens stated that with Ray Utter, IHMSA Secretary/Treasurer, not present at the match that the meetings from the 2018 members' meeting were unavailable. (Editor's note: The notes were published in the November/December 2018 issue of the *IHMSA News*.)
4. Rule Changes – Dell Taylor, Rules Committee
 - a. Production cartridges allowed in the Field Pistol/Practical Hunter Short Course:
 - i. The .30-20 has officially been listed since many barrels are marked .30-20 rather than .32-20 even though both use the same case. Shooters have been using this cartridge in field pistol/practical hunter short course for decades. The listing was to clear up any potential confusion.
 - ii. .300 Whisper/.300 Blackout
 1. We still have the target damage rule, so if shooters are damaging the targets with this cartridge with their loads, they will have to discontinue that course of fire.
 2. The Rules Committee will reevaluate this decision if there are reports of problems with target damage.
 - iii. The rules committee can reevaluate allowable cartridges at any time including the .300 Whisper/Blackout.
 - b. Production cartridges not allowed in the Field Pistol/Practical Hunter Short Course:
 - i. .454 Casull because of target damage.
 - ii. .22 K Hornet – the additional case capacity of the K modified case adds enough velocity to cause target damage.
 - iii. .256 Winchester
 - iv. .221 Fireball – the small diameter bullet in this case is prone to target damage.
 - c. A rule has been proposed about encroaching on a neighbor's shooting position. This rule has been taken under advisement, but has not been adopted. It was decided to make shooters aware of the situation and rely on common courtesy at this time. If this continues to be an issue, the rule will be reconsidered.
 - i. Joe Cullison read the rule to the assembled members.
 - ii. The proposed rule stated: No competitor shall encroach or interfere with another competitor's designated shooting lane. The offending shooter will be warned on the first offense by a line officer and removed from the line for a second offense. If the encroachment resulted in physical contact with another competitor, an alibi will be provided at the match director's discretion.
5. Old Business – The case against Cindy Smith for embezzling IHMSA funds.
 - a. As of 31 August 2018, the Deputy District Attorney handling the case resigned and a new DDA was assigned to the case in Wyoming.

-
- b. Mrs. Smith failed to obtain the loan she promised to use to pay restitution for what was stolen in the state of Wyoming. She was to do this by 31 August 2018 to avoid a felony conviction.
 - c. Smith's attorney requested a 30-day extension. Over the strenuous objection of Mrs. Cullison to this extension without evidence of prior applications, the new DDA gave her a 30-day extension without any proffer of proof.
 - d. In November 2018, a new DA was elected and she fired nearly the entire Deputy staff and hired new attorneys. Our new DDA was furious with the deal made by the previous DDA, but had to abide by the deal since it had already been submitted to the court.
 - e. Tina Cullison wrote a victim impact statement on behalf of the Association and submitted to the authorities in Wyoming detailing the history of lies and delays meant to benefit the Smiths over IHMSA.
 - f. When Mrs. Smith was before the judge in Wyoming the judge asked Mrs Smith how she would pay and did not seem to be buying her excuses.
 - g. As part of Mrs. Cullison's impact statement, she showed Dave Smith, Cindy Smith's husband, posting pictures of his Barrett rifle. The shooters assembled know how expensive these Barrett rifles are. There was also a picture of him "flipping the bird" at IHMSA.
 - h. Mrs. Smith has made 2 payments totaling approximately \$5,800 which is about 10% of what is owed as of the Board Meeting. (Since the board meeting we have received another \$2,500 bringing the total to \$8,300 as of August.)
 - i. Mrs. Smith had previously stated she would pay \$500 twice a month. A member asked if IHMSA would get interest. The answer was "no" – Wyoming law does not provide for interest payments.
 - j. The Parole Board has not been telling Mrs. Cullison what is happening regarding the reparation payment. Since her last call, Mrs. Cullison has found a Wyoming statue that they must inform the victim and she will be following up.
 - k. The amount of reparation Mrs. Smith owes for the amount she embezzled in the state of Wyoming is just under \$57,000.
 - l. Mrs. Cullison is still working to find what the restitution payment plan is.
 - m. Dan Meserve, a resident of Wyoming, stated that he had followed similar cases in the paper and saw that no interest on the outstanding reparation would be paid and the offender would have to have committed a financial crime in excess of \$250,000 before serving jail time.
 - n. Mrs. Smith is now a convicted felon and reparation is a condition of her parole.
 - o. The assembled members gave Mrs. Cullison a standing ovation for all her efforts she has and is taking on behalf of the Association.
6. A question was raised whether the proposed rule on encroachment on a neighbor's shooting position applied to all ranges or just the Oklahoma City range where the spacing for big bore pigs and turkeys is particularly tight. The answer was that it applies to all ranges where the problem might exist.
 7. The proposed rule on red dot sights being allowed for seniors in the production and revolver classes was allowed to die on the vine 1 January 2019 when the 2 year trial period expired. The members spent time discussing the proposal.
-

- a. Jim Fields made the proposal with the intention of getting more participation in the production and revolver classes. He expects that, if implemented, that within 3 years there would be an increase in participation in these 2 categories.
 - b. Mr. Taylor said that some of the technical information on the way the proposed rule was written did not match the intention. The rule needs to be resubmitted with better wording to match the rule to the intention.
 - c. Jim Fields stated that the Oklahoma City Gun Club will continue to allow this on an unsanctioned basis much as they shot the 500 meter match unsanctioned before this was added as sanctioned categories.
 - d. There has also been a proposal to add red dot sighted revolvers as a category of practical hunter.
 - e. Mr. Taylor asked all to think this issue over especially in regards to adding yet another category.
 - f. Most opposition to the proposed rule has been that this provides an unlevel playing field especially with the advancement of red dot sights that now allow fine adjustments. This is unlevel because shooters eyesight deteriorates at different rates as opposed to an arbitrary 60 years of age.
 - g. The question was raised as to what other shooting disciplines allow scoped and iron sights in the same category. The only one offered was NRA Bullseye (now known as Precision Pistol).
 - h. Rich Hawkins raised the question of what is the difference between a red dot sight and a 1x scope especially now that Leopold makes a red dot with ½ minute click adjustments.
 - i. The variables of the optics that could be used needs to be examined and defined before a rule is made.
 - j. Mr. Taylor stated that in reality there are few guns that fit the production category as defined in the IHMSA rules any more. A T/C needs an aftermarket barrel because the barrels currently produced are a minimum of 12 inches. Freedom Arms makes guns that qualify as production, but the price point is high for new shooters that are unsure of their continued participation. (Editor's note, E. Arthur Brown still lists 2 production category BF pistols on the website. One in .22lr priced at \$1395 to which iron sights would need to be added and a limited edition (only 5) big bore pistol in 7 US.)
 - k. Many believe the red dot gives the shooter a definite advantage over iron sights.
 - l. Very few are still shooting the 3 and 4 gun aggregate. It was stated that this indicates the essence has gone out of the sport.
 - m. The opinion of the assembled members was divided on whether this would increase participation in the production and revolver categories. The argument against the increase was that there are so many categories that shooters are shooting different categories since there is not enough time at a monthly match to shoot them all for most shooters.
8. With a quorum being present at the meeting, Joe Cullison made a motion that the quorum for future delegates meetings be reduced to 20. Stuart Barrett seconded. Warren Alkire proposed an amendment to the motion that it state 20 members since the meeting is now open to all members at the match and no longer requires the delegates pass signed by the home club secretary as was done in the distant past. Brett Dunalp seconded the proposed amendment to

- the motion and Mr. Cullison accepted the amendment. Dell Taylor proposed another amendment that the motion include “members meeting at the World Championships”. Mr. Alkire seconded and the amendment was accepted.
- a. The motion made with amendments accepted was stated as “I move that the quorum for conducting business at the annual members meeting held at the annual World Championships be reduced to 20 members present.”
 - b. The motion passed unanimously.
9. The only bid for the World Championships for 2020 was from the Oklahoma City Gun Club. The proposed dates are 17-25 July 2020.
- a. A question was raised to see if the dates could be moved to avoid the heat in July.
 - b. Earlier in the summer is the end of the tornado season in Oklahoma and August is still quite hot as well as causing problems for the beginning of school with training camps beginning in early August before school starts.
10. Mr. Martens opened the floor for discussion regarding whether it was necessary to pre-register for times for the World Championships. Some of the points raised are listed below.
- a. The International teams need a confirmation of entry to get their guns into the country.
 - b. The International teams also need an invitation letter.
 - c. A concern was raised that Saturday morning would be a “zoo” with all the competitors looking to register and get started first thing. It was crazy this year even with pre-registration.
 - d. The Board is looking for a way to simplify the registration as it takes a volunteer to handle the pre-registration.
 - e. One option was to make picking times optional.
 - f. There are some shooters that need to be able to shoot the first relay and last relay to get all of their guns in especially when spotting for each other. This requires pre-registering for times.
11. A motion was made to adjourn at 9:04. The motion died for lack of a second.
12. Doug Edney had found the notes from the 2018 delegates meeting on the IHMSA web site and asked about the things covered during a normal meeting, specifically about the Association’s financials and the reports of the regional directors.
13. Mr. Martens shared the last email from Ray Utter, IHMSA Secretary/Treasurer. The email was from Mr. Utter’s 1 May update.
- a. \$9559.18 in checking
 - b. \$45,029.11 in savings
 - c. These amounts do not include Cindy Smith’s last 2 reparation payments.
 - d. \$4206.00 is the Newsletter cost.
 - e. 337 annual members renewed. The number of life members was not included in the email.
 - f. A membership analysis showed that since 2010 IHMSA is losing about 200 members a year. Since 2016, IHMSA is gaining about 60 new or returning members.
14. The regional directors for regions I – III were not present to present a report.
15. Region IV – Jim Fields
- a. Oklahoma has 1 range, Kansas 4 and Texas 3.
 - b. The regionals will again be held at the Oklahoma City Gun club on 3 – 6 October 2019.
-

16. Region V – John Richards
 - a. Status quo for ranges and shooters.
 - b. Ken LaCroix has had a bad turn in health and may have to be put in a care facility.
 - c. 2 ranges in Minnesota, 2 in Wisconsin and a range starting up.
 - d. 2 ranges in Wisconsin shoot IHMSA rules, but have no IHMSA members. This is common at many ranges. Those operating the range seemed unconcerned when approached about this.
17. Region VI – Dell Taylor
 - a. Nevada has poor participation. The monthly match at Las Vegas is about an hour long before the heat becomes intolerable.
 - b. Arizona has 3 ranges.
 - c. Utah has no ranges because there is no open land to put a range since most of the rural land is owned by the Bureau of Land Management.
 - d. Idaho has 1 active range in Idaho Falls. A typical match is 22 shooters and 67 guns.
 - e. Hawaii has 3 or 4 guys shooting. Burt and Kevan were unable to come because Burt had eye surgery.
18. Regions 7 – Joe Cullison
 - a. 2 clubs in Oregon. Grant's Pass is air pistol only.
 - b. There is a new match director in Portland.
 - c. 3 ranges in California. One is weekday only. Sunnyville is a new range.
 - d. 1 in Washington State.
19. Region 8
 - a. Russell Plakke, region director, was unable to attend the match because of an injury sustained at the Pringle match shortly before the World Championships.
 - b. There are no new ranges and none lost.
 - c. It may be possible to develop IHMSA shooting on existing ranges.
 - d. There are some younger shooters.
 - e. There is a new Wyoming State director.
 - f. The regional championship went well. Shooters came from all over from Texas to Canada and Australia.
20. Australia – Russel Mowles
 - a. They have now sorted out the "hiccups" on qualifications for the Nationals.
 - b. The 39th annual Nationals will be in Victoria.
 - c. They are hoping to have the 40th Nationals in the national capital of Canberra. To make the range suitable for IHMSA a 20 meter high berm is being constructed.
 - d. Plan to have more shooters at the World Championship next year.
 - e. Australia now has a National Smallbore team at the World Championships.
21. Brazil – Don Frasier
 - a. Brazil has had 4 matches at the national level and the South American Championship.
 - b. The matches live off of long gun entries. A typical ratio are 10 handgun entries to 30 long gun entries.
 - c. They must import handguns as there are no IHMSA competitive handguns produced by Brazilian industry.
 - d. It is difficult to get young shooters since guns have a bad social stigma.

- e. To have guns requires a special registration with the military.
 - f. Any scopes over 5X must be registered.
 - g. The military controls reloading materials and equipment. Equipment must be registered.
22. Dell Taylor mentioned a new .22lr bolt action pistol in the works by Voodoo gun works.
- a. It is similar to the Remington 40X type action, but scaled for .22lr.
 - b. Barreled actions can be purchased from the web site for approximately \$1700.
 - c. Mr. Taylor would like to see their web site point to the IHMSA web site. This provides targeted exposure and would be great for all manufactures of silhouette type handguns.
23. Dell Taylor reported that no new production category guns were approved. There are very few guns available that meet the production category.
24. Dan Meserve made a motion that the meeting adjourn at 9:24 PM. Dell Taylor seconded. The motion passed and the meeting was adjourned.

LEGENDS OF SILHOUETTE #8

STEVE MARTENS

by the Old Guy

There are a fair number of quite good shooters in IHMSA, fellows who have won lots of matches including the old Internationals and current World Championships who are not Legends of Silhouette. In order to qualify as a Legend of Silhouette it is necessary to do something genuinely outstanding, spectacular. For a number of years IHMSA past president Steve Martens fell into the former category, but on June 2, 2019 at the Oklahoma City Gun Club he finally achieved the spectacular. He shot the first 40x40 on the 500 meter course of fire with an iron sighted handgun.

Why do I say this is spectacular? Why do I believe this is second only to the 40x40 in iron sights standing, either small bore or big bore. The reason is simple. A relatively small group of handgun silhouette shooters has been shooting the 500 meter course of fire at least as far back as 1983, and maybe even before that. Almost all the really good freestyle shooters had tried, some of them a lot of times at the time in their careers when they were at their best, and none of them was able to do it.

This includes shooters like John Dunn who holds the 157x160 big bore aggregate record, Scott Mann who shot more 40x40s in half size than anyone else (He now has over 140 perfect scores on half size.), Richard Mishler who shot 319x320 on the NRA four gun freestyle aggregate and was the first shooter to reach 50 40x40s in iron sights half size, and all of the other shooters who have shot the 500 meter Grand Slam iron sights (ten in a row of each animal on different occasions).

The 40x40 in iron sights on the 500 meter course of fire increasingly appeared to be like accelerating a particle to the speed of light. The closer you got the particle to lights speed, the greater its mass, and theoretically at light speed, its mass would become infinite. Conditions had to be near perfection not just for one or two banks but for eight banks. Even on some of the better ranges where wind would be relatively gentle and consistent, all it would take was one mild puff of wind around 385 meters from the firing line, a puff of wind it would be impossible to detect from wind flags, and you would lose one or two targets no matter how perfectly you were holding. As for achieving this at a range with substantial, conflicting wind currents, that was out of the question.

Steve started shooting IHMSA silhouette in 1995 after shooting small bore rifle silhouette. In 1998 he attended his first Internationals with Ken LaCroix in Oakridge and shot an 80x80

in Production. In 2004 he shot 80x80s in scoped and iron sights half size and first won the Iron Man in 2001. He is one of only two shooters whose name is on the Gold Gun three times for winning small bore Unlimited at the Internationals. Obviously he has had an illustrious career up to now.

He first began shooting the 500 meter course of fire around 2005, and he consistently shot 30+ scores in iron sights. Prior to the 40x40, he had high scores of 36x40 and 37x40, and he had achieved the Grand Slam and the scoped 40x40, too.

More recently he had begun experimenting with other options than Creedmore in the freestyle events, most notably the flop position devised by Jim Fields. This is limited to ranges that are flat or downhill, but the Oklahoma City range is ideal for it. Being a tinkerer, Steve decided the ideal cartridge for this is the 6.5 TKS, and he decided the ideal sight system was some form of double aperture tube sight, but he had difficulty getting the rings to align so he built himself a tube with a Merit iris at the breach end. Since the flop position enabled him to get fairly close to the iris, he was able to use a very small aperture at the muzzle end. This meant he could center the target in the front ring more precisely and simultaneously insure that the rear ring formed by the aperture was concentric with the front aperture.

He had not load tested for accuracy in this pistol. He just referred to the large data base put on line by Jim Harris of the Los Angeles Silhouette Club, and found several loads that were suitable for the different targets. The load for chickens was 30.1gr. N-133 for the 107 gr. Sierra MatchKing. He experimented with N-140 and 139 gr. Lapua bullets and 142 gr. Sierra MatchKings for pigs, turkeys, and rams.

He came from his home in Minnesota to the Oklahoma City Gun Club to experiment on June 2. He was not serious about attempting to shoot the 40x40 at that time. He just planned to check out sight settings and refine the system as it might be necessary. After sighting in he cleaned the chickens and pigs, but he still did not take this to be serious. He hit the first turkey high on the back, came down a bit, and cleaned the next four turkeys. Then to make matters worse, after shooting and hitting the first five turkeys, the auto reset bar behind his bank of turkeys, bank 4, would not go down, so he had to move to bank 2. This was nerve wracking, just what you do not need when you are clean after the chickens, pigs, and first five turkeys, but he cleaned the rest of the turkeys. At this point the whole thing became very serious.

He had had only three rounds for ram sighters, and his first shot had been four feet below the sighter target. At that point he had come up half a turn on the Unertl knob and the second sighter was a bit over the back. He came down slightly and managed to hit the third sighter, but he did not have enough ammunition to double check that hit, so when he came to the first ram for record still clean, the pressure was on for a perfect hold hoping for a hit

from which he could adjust his sight toward the center.

He was able to hit the #1 ram and adjust toward the center and clean the first bank. The pressure on the second bank was what you might expect, enough to make almost anyone tremble. He got decent hits on #1, #2, and #3. By #4 his heart rate had risen substantially which is part of why this is such a difficult record to achieve. He hit #4 low, and he thought that if he missed #5, he would have wasted a once in a lifetime opportunity. His vision of the sights got fuzzy on #5, and he stopped, took a deep breath, and started again. After he shot the shot and saw the ram start to go down, he yelled really loud. Who would not be ecstatic at such a point?

One thing which added to the difficulty of this achievement is that he shot this simultaneous with a 200 meter match so that the time for each bank was only two minutes, not the usual 500 meter two and a half minutes.

At this point there is one more thing to note. Steve's spotter for this spectacular accomplishment was Tim Ablay, a local Oklahoma City fellow who obviously was able to see and call the hits accurately. Congratulations also to Tim for a job well done.
