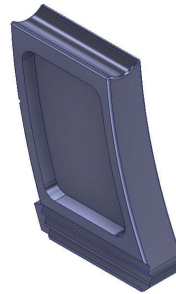

SANCTION FEE RULES REMINDER

Per SECTION IX: Match Procedures of the IHMSA Rule Book:

4. Delinquency in remitting sanction fees may affect the designation of 'good standing' of a match. The following policy applies to delinquent remittance of sanction fees:

A) Matches more than 30 days delinquent (60 days after the date of the match) shall not be eligible to send delegates to the annual business meeting.

B) After 90 days delinquency (120 days after the date of the match), the matter will be brought up for review of sanction revocation by the Executive Committee

5. Any organization hosting sanctioned matches that fails to adhere to IHMSA rules may have their sanction withdrawn by the Executive Committee. In the event of sanction being withdrawn, the affected organization shall, upon written request to the Secretary/Treasurer, be able to have the decision reviewed by the Board of Directors.

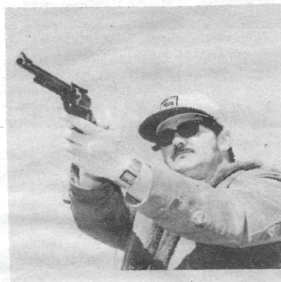

DRAMATIC IMPACT ON HANDGUN WORLD

Nothing has ever hit the handgun world with the dramatic impact of metallic silhouette shooting!

On past occasions, when firing at paper targets with one of the big magnums, I've felt a sense of massive overkill. Even football-sized rocks on the side of a nearby hill seemed like flimsy targets for the smashing thunderbolts delivered from such as the .41 and .44 magnums, the .357 and .44 Auto Mags and a few others.

The subject is academic now. There's an exciting new game in town that provides worthy opponents for big bore handguns, a game called metallic silhouettes. It is also the most interesting and exhilarating shooting sport that has appeared on the horizon in many a year.

Try it once and you will likely be hooked for good. Even minor successes will bring instant gratification. On the other hand you may feel a sense of frustration and near impotence. You will probably walk away from the firing line with the sudden realization that your big magnum isn't as potent as you thought it was. You may feel a bit ineffectual; at least thoughtful and subdued. And you can hardly wait to try it again!

Furthermore, it opens up a whole new world of handgun ballistics that will add new pages to the loading manuals. During the past six months as much or more progress has been made in long range handgun shooting as regards equipment, loads and techniques as in the past six years.

There is something about the game that appeals to whatever latent instinct there is inside a man that wants action whenever he pulls the trigger.

Action is the name of metallic silhouette shooting. As a spectator sport it has no equal in the shooting world. Punching holes in paper targets at short distances has heretofore been the accepted technique of handgun competition. Silhouette shooting adds a new dimension.

As practise for actual hunting in the field it is a country mile ahead of anything else on the horizon. For the man who doesn't hunt, for whatever the reason, but likes the machismo of shooting big bore handguns, it is the perfect game.

For the uninitiated, here is a taste of what metallic silhouette shooting is all about.

Level down on a half-inch-thick steel plate chicken painted flat black at fifty meters

with your favorite .357 magnum, .44 special, Auto Mag or whatever. A low hit will take the leg out from under the steel bird with a gratifying clang. A hit high on the back can tumble it end over end. A fore or aft hit can send it spinning wildly. A miss will likely send up a spurt of dirt -- and you will miss a lot of them.

Next is the lifesize Javelina silhouette at 100 meters, also of half-inch plate. Five of them are standing on a bank about ten feet higher than the shooting line. Miss, Miss, Miss. Then a satisfying clang from a solid hit that topples the steel pig over.

Then you are up on the side of a valley shooting downhill at a row of lifesize turkeys, 150 meters distant. More misses. Then you settle down, dig in and squeeze off a shot with tooth-gritting concentration. The chosen turkey turns slowly to one side from a front hit then topples over slowly as the hit clang comes back up the slope. How sweet it is!

Then, suddenly, it's your turn to shoot the rams. My God, you think, as you look at those tiny black silhouettes over on the other side of the valley. They too are lifesize. But shooting them at 200 meters?

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

The following letter from Arizona is the editorial subject for this issue.

To the Editor:

There has been some discussion here about free style shooting as allowed by IHMSA rules. Was this decision made with the idea that metallic silhouette shooting simulates hunting conditions or do you intend to discard one or more of the shooting positions in the future? Obviously, an off-hand shooter can't compete equally with a man using the prone position and the prone shooter will win all the trophies.

It is the general consensus of opinion that handgun silhouette shooting is basically a simulation of hunting. Shooting is at metal silhouettes of birds and animals.

The subject was thoroughly discussed during the formation meeting of IHMSA and when finally put to the vote there was near unanimous approval of free style shooting as long as there was no artificial rests, supports, slings, etc. as specifically listed in the rules.

The term Free Style was used on the basis that in the field the hunter is going to use whatever position or technique that will give him the best possible shot.

To insert a few personal comments, while never having made a career out of handgun hunting, I have used a handgun in the field on a few occasions. In North America I've bagged two antelopes. Several prior misses before ultimate success will not be discussed here, but each occasion required a long, belly-crawling stalk to get within range, and each time I used the classic front-facing prone position with the back of my left hand flat on the ground, the butt of the pistol resting on it and my right hand firmly around the grip.

Why?

Simply because it was flat country and where I was hidden behind a small sage bush there was nothing to rest the gun on or against. Had I stood up to shoot or tried to assume a kneeling or sitting position I might have got one shot off at the antelope running flat-out at 300 yards instead of 125 yards from the prone position.

While hunting big game in Africa it has been my policy to carry a 4-inch .357 revolver when stalking dangerous game. The idea was that some day I might have one of the dangerous animals on top of me, at which distance a rifle is rather useless. There might be a bare possibility of bringing a revolver to bear.

Fortunately, that exact situation never occurred, but on one occasion, after being treed by an enraged Cape buffalo, I rested the .357 over a limb with both hands and put a 158-grain metal-piercing slug between his eyes at about thirty feet. It was an instant kill.

Another time I used the .357 to shoot an African lion off of a hunting companion at fifteen feet. He had gut-shot the lion with a .470 double rifle, necessitating a follow up stalk in fairly dense cover. My shooting position that time was kneeling, using both hands.

On still another occasion a rhino unexpectedly charged in dense thorn bush and caught one of our gunbearers. The professional hunter fired twice, breaking both front shoulders of the huge beast. As it fell, the gunbearer was pinned by one leg as was my rifle he had been carrying. The rhino was still very much alive and making efforts to get up with his hind legs although his front quarters were paralyzed. I put the .357 in his ear and fired twice to end the skirmish. In the adrenalin-charged excitement of the moment I never could recall my exact position, but it was some kind of an off-hand crouch.

The point to all of this is I was using whatever free style position the circumstances dictated at the moment. All would have been legal by current IHMSA rules except resting the gun over a limb to shoot the Cape buffalo.

Actually, before anyone gets uptight about positions, there is one good solution that makes the subject academic. First, there is no IHMSA rule that says a club sponsoring a sanctioned match can't put up a trophy or trophies for the high scores posted in any and/or all positions. All scores shot in a sanctioned match will be registered, but IHMSA has no say over the disbursement of trophies. If any club has a group of, say, off-hand shooters, they may award trophies for 1st, 2nd and 3rd for the off-hand position or any other position.

Secondly, four large and beautiful trophies -- in addition to the rest of the championship trophies -- have been sponsored for the National Championships for the four major positions. Off-hand, kneeling, sitting and prone. There also will be second and third places for each position. The definition of prone in the deed of gift for the trophies specifies that any reclining position wherein any portion of the shooter's body above the waist shall touch the ground or ground cover shall be considered a prone position.

Thus, National IHMSA champions will be recognized for the off-hand, kneeling, sitting and prone positions on a final condition in the trophy deed of gift that a minimum of ten entries must complete the national course of fire in any of the four positions in order for the trophy to be awarded and the championship recognized.

So come on, you shooters preferring one position or another, round up your troops and start practising. There is honor, glory, prestige and trophies for all.

As a final point, there have been some suggestions to include a third category in IHMSA rules, a scoped handgun class along with the suggestion that this category be shot from the off-hand position only, just as scoped rifle silhouette shooting is done.

This, and other subjects, suggested rule changes, modifications or additions will be discussed at the annual meeting. In the meantime, any input on this or any other subject as regards handgun silhouette shooting is welcome and will get space in THE SILHOUETTE.

SANCTIONED MATCHES

IHMSA has no intention of imposing upon, or making any special demands of any club or association now holding handgun silhouette matches or plans to do so in the future. Our position is one of friendly cooperation with the best interests of all handgun silhouette shooters at heart so that competitors may go anywhere and shoot with standard rules.

Requirements for IHMSA sanctioned matches are, we feel, quite fair and simple. Request for a date, or notification of the executive director of a shoot date and place, which information will be printed in THE SILHOUETTE for the notice of all members and interested parties that the match is sanctioned and will be shot by IHMSA rules.

A one-dollar fee for each registered contestant to be sent to the Director's office along with the match scores which will be published in THE SILHOUETTE. As just one of several services offered, IHMSA has special printed bulletin score sheets, contestant scorecards, etc. The head office also will maintain a record of all scores and averages which will be invaluable to sponsors of a sanctioned match when there is any question about the classification of a shooter.

At this time there is no mandatory requirement that all shooters competing in a sanctioned match be IHMSA members although we naturally encourage anyone to join as the total benefits for the five-dollar yearly membership fee are a bargain, especially as IHMSA is a non-profit association.

Finally, while we encourage clubs to hold sanctioned matches there is no mandatory requirement for this. A club can hold their regular or practice shoots at any time, and possibly a sanctioned match once every month or so. To use an example, the Fort Bliss Rod and Gun Club of El Paso, Texas holds their sanctioned matches on the second Sunday of each month, which match is followed by a special 22 silhouette event, non sanctioned. IHMSA has no objection to any club adding special or other events to a program of their own choosing as only the basic 40-shot silhouette match or multiples thereof will be sanctioned and registered.

With a handgun? Nobody can hit one at that distance!

But they do. Maybe you miss the first five, the first ten, or maybe hit one on a leg. You get the satisfaction of a clang but the ram remains standing with regal contempt. Finally, with perseverance, skill, determination and luck, the moment comes when you tag a ram solidly and watch with bated breath as the distant silhouette seems to hang in suspended motion, then slowly, majestically, it topples off the rail. I tell you, pistoleros, there just isn't anything to equal it in the realm of paper or any other kind of artificial target shooting.

I doubt anyone will forget the thrill of toppling that first ram. But you won't be long satisfied with just one because there are five in a bank and you get one shot at each.

Spectator interest? Wow! Let any shooter blow down the first four silhouettes on any bank and you can bet that every eye at the range will be watching as he buckles down -- probably with the two-minute shooting limit coming to an end -- to fire at the last target. There will be groans of sympathy if he misses, solid applause if he cleans the rack.

That's metallic silhouette shooting. It isn't the only handgun game in town, but for sheer, spine-tingling exhilaration, it's way ahead of whatever is in second place. It is, in one simple phrase, the epitome of long range handgunning.

LADIES COMPETE IN SILHOUETTE MATCHES

Don't get the idea that metallic silhouette shooting, even if a macho game, is limited to men. Out on the west coast a few of the gals are shooting with the best of them.

Osie McAbee, of Puente, California, won the ladies trophy in the first IHMSA sanctioned match on January 8-9 using a .308 XP-100. Annie Ingram took the ladies trophy in the March 12-13 match with an unlimited .30-223 Thompson-Center Contender.
