East Coast Championships Becomes Major Player



The East Coast Championship has really set the bar high as we enter the heart of the silhouette season. A total of 223 entries were shot at this year's event, which is in just its second year of existence. That is a significant increase over the 153 entries pulled in last year. The fact that there was that big of a jump in entries is even more impressive when you factor in the less than ideal weather, which varied from rain, strong winds, and changing cloud conditions.

Shooters from as far away as New York converged to Lawrenceburg, KY for this event, and there was some impressive shooting on display. Several people made legs into their next class, and two jumped class. Jim Kesser shot an impressive 54x60 in Big Bore Unlimited Standing. I'm not sure what the World Record for a 60 round match is in BB US, but I know the Small Bore record is 57x60, so that is a heck of a performance by Jim. In addition, three people broke into the 3-gun Presidents 100 Club.

A big congratulations goes out to Greg Rhineheimer and all of the people involved in making the ECC a rapidly growing event in IHMSA. For full details on the ECC, please see this month's match report.

The New Silhouette

While it's fun to shoot my S&W Model 629 Classic, full house 44 magnum loads aren't fun for very long. After about 25 rounds in a session, I've had it. It's much more pleasant to shoot this gun with "light magnum" loads or 44 Special cartridges. Like the ubiquitous 357 Magnum/38 Special combination, many shooters like me favor the lighter 44 of the 44 Magnum/44 Special combination.

For people who do not reload, one of the further features of using factory 38 Special cartridges over 357 Magnum cartridges is pricing. 38 Special cartridges are significantly less expensive than comparable 357 Magnum loads and there are promotional 38 Special loads (during "normal" supply/demand times) that are even less costly. This is not the case with the 44 Special v 44 Magnum choice, the former being considerably more expensive and the choices quite a bit fewer.

For reloaders, the cost of brass is about the same for either the 44 Magnum or 44 Special, comparing brand to brand for the different cases. However, due to the sheer number of available spent 44 Magnum cases, mostly my own, I have no need to buy cases, just recharge them. While I have had many hundreds (I don't think thousands, but maybe) of 44 Magnum cartridges and cases pass through my hands, the number of 44 Specials has been minimal. At my most recent reloading session, as typical, I had only empty 44 Magnum cases and no 44 Special cases at all. Having a sufficient supply of full 44 Magnum loads, my goal was to go to the light side on loading.

The options are to trim the 44 Magnum cases to 44 Special length and use published loads for true 44 Special performance or approximate 44 Special performance by loading full length 44 Magnum cases with adjusted load recipes. Unfortunately, there is not very much reliable source data for loading the larger cases to true 44 Special performance. The exception is for some publishers' data for lead bullets in Cowboy Action shooting, as for example, that published in Hornady's Reloading Manual. I have yet to trip over similar data for jacketed bullets. It may be there but I've yet to see it.

The extra bit (approximately 1/8") of case length of a 44 Magnum case over a 44 Special case creates enough increase in case capacity to affect actual range results - not better, not worse, just different. I don't usually like to fiddle with published data and wish the powder, bullet and reloading manufacturers would publish "Safe Squib Loads for the 44 Magnum," but I do have enough experience to accomplish my goals safely. Besides, for all the labors of reloading that I enjoy, the one that I really don't relish

is case trimming. Whether with manual crank or motorized, taking a full 1/8" off a lot of cases, then chamfering inside and outside the mouth, is not for me.

44 Special loads or loads that approximate 44 Special performance are quite suitable for Field Pistol. While 44 Magnum loads are Field Pistol legal, the battering that a shooter will take is unnecessary for the task at hand. My very first IHMSA competition back in the last Millennium was entered using the aforementioned S&W Model 629 with Magnum loads. I shot one entry in Big Bore Standing and one in Field Pistol. Those 80 rounds (why bother with the shootoffs since I hardly hit anything in Big Bore anyway) were 55 more than my stopping threshold of 25 rounds. At that point, I knew I had trajectory problems with Big Bore and I was way overpowered for Field Pistol. On the positive side, my appetite for IHMSA was whet and here I am today.

Graduating to more IHMSA suitable guns and cartridges, I don't use the 44 Magnum for Big Bore Standing anymore. At our range in Falls Township Rifle and Pistol Association, the baffles that cover the top of the range to prevent flyers from leaving the grounds are too low to allow for the trajectory at the 200 yard rams. The only way for me to clear the baffles while holding over on the rams is to bend my knees to lower myself a few inches. That's hardly the way to establish a good firm shooting stance. While I could shoot Big Bore from a Creedmore or other grounded position, there are much better choices than the 44 Magnum.

Having experimented with various 44 Magnum loads over the years ranging from 180 grain to 300 grain bullets, the trajectories are reasonable out to the turkeys, but all drop a nominal three feet from the turkeys to the rams. Some are as "flat" as 32" or so and some go as high as around 40+" so I've lumped them all into about three feet. I run out of clicks for that kind of drop, so my options are guessing the holdover which totally blocks out the rams, or using a separate front sight that easily pops into the spring-loaded detent of the barrel. Neither of these choices is ideal and I'm not sure, one way or the other, if changing the front sight in the midst of a relay is IHMSA legal. I can't find a rule that holds against it, but it just doesn't smell right to me.

On the other hand, at Field Pistol distances, the 44 Magnum is not affected by the ridiculous drop at Big Bore distances. However, switching to 44 Special performance levels also results in reasonable drop and keeps the power and recoil to an also reasonable level. Hence, that's what I've been shooting for Field Pistol lately.

Right now I'm reloading a lot of 302 mixed cases, all of which have been prepped through the cleaning, polishing, sizing, decapping, and belling phase. For bullets, I have both jacketed and lead on hand. Either way, I'll go with a standard weight 240 grain bullet and the choose a powder charge that covers all 302 rounds. Regular large pistol primers have worked just fine for me with all the powders I've tried. However, I do have one partial box of CCI 350 Magnum primers on hand for which I have no other use, so in these days of iffy supply, I will use them up on some of the cases. Since the 302 cases cover several brands, I'll only use the Magnum primers on a few of them, separating the final loaded rounds by headstamp. The largest sub-lots are Federal and PMC, covering almost 200 of the overall quantity;

these will get regular CCI 300 primers. After that, I'll choose a safe powder and charge from my dwindling supply, keeping in mind that the hotter Magnum primers will give different results for those cartridges in which it is used.

Recently, a very knowledgeable IHMSA shooter and reloader reminded me of the sometimes wide disparity of data even when using only those sources that I would deem reputable. It is always best to check several sources before proceeding to reload. If there is ever any doubt as to the safety of a load, there should be no choice in the decision to be made. Simply don't try it. Just as there are too many reputable sources to necessitate the use of data from lesser known sources, there are too many well established safe recipes to negate the use of any that are suspect.

Practical Hunter - A Great Starting Point For New Shooters

Though it has been an official category for a couple of years now, there seems to be a lot of questions or simply a lack of knowledge of Practical Hunter. This is a shame, because this is probably the best event IHMSA has to offer for the new or inexperienced shooter.

In a nutshell, there are three Practical Hunter classes, one each for Big Bore (called Practical Hunter Long Course), Field Pistol (PH Short Course), and Small Bore (.22LR Course). Each are shot at the same targets and distances as any other event within that discipline—i.e. PH Long Course is shot at Big Bore targets and distances, PH Short Course is on the Field Pistol range, and so on.

Here is what makes Practical Hunter different from other offerings in IHMSA. First of all, the beginning shooter can shoot off a rest, such as a bipod or sandbags. This in itself is a fantastic way to get an inexperienced shooter started, as it is much safer than using your body for support, and the shooter can focus on foundational principles of shooting such as sight picture and trigger while simply getting comfortable with not only the firearm, but also range commands, timing, and sight adjustments. Once the shooter exceeds A & AA (A=0-15, AA=16-25), then

they can no longer use the bipod or bags, and are left to the same requirements as any freestyle category as far as support is concerned. But by this point, they have gotten some trigger time and familiarity with the firearm as well as how a match runs, so they have had a good introduction in which they also were able to have had some success in hitting targets.

There are a few other key differences with Practical Hunter. There is no designation between open sights or scopes, but there is a limitation of 6x for those using scopes. There is no barrel length restriction, but overall length of the firearm cannot exceed 21 inches. This eliminates some of the unlimited guns, thus making this more of a production-type event, which was part of the intent with installing this category.

Rules for Practical Hunter are printed monthly on page 3 of the *IHMSA News*, so if this is a category you haven't heard of or tried, cut it out and put it in your shooting box. Maybe your local range or club isn't aware of it, but since there is no extra target setup needed, there is no reason a club couldn't or shouldn't offer the category. For new or less experienced shooters, this is a great way to get them started in IHMSA.

New IHMSA Practical Hunter Classes

IHMSA is proposing to add 3 new Practical hunter classes on a 2 year trail basis to start Jan. 1, 2011 and end Dec. 31, 2012. These are optional classes to be offered at the discretion of the local match directors. They not required to be offered at any State, Regional, or World Championship match. The purpose of adding these classes is to offer new shooters with hunting style handguns a place to compete with like style handguns in IHMSA.

New Class Names
Practical Hunter Long Course
Practical Hunter Short Course
Practical Hunter .22 LR Course

Class descriptions

All 3 classes are to be shot from any SAFE freestyle position including Prone, Kneeling, Sitting, or Standing.

The Practical Hunter Long Course will be shot on the 200 meter Big Bore range with the standard full size targets at their normal ranges.

The Practical Hunter Short Course will be shot on the 100 meter Field Pistol range with the standard targets at their normal ranges. The standard FP straight wall cartridges only.

The Practical Hunter .22LR Course will be shot on the 100 yard Small Bore range with the standard full size targets at their normal ranges.

Class Rules

Any hunting style handgun with a maximum overall length of 21 inches.

Optics are allowed up to a maximum of 6x power.

Gun must be as manufactured with only cosmetic modifications

Ported barrels are allowed as long as they are shot from a safe position.

A rest such as a bipod or a sandbag supporting the barrel in a prone position may be used by a new unclassified shooter and by shooters in classes A and AA.

Follow-Up to Ken Horowitz April Article

I wanted to give Ken Horowitz some feedback on his very nice article in the April issue. It is always good to have points regarding loading, reloading and appropriate cartridges in this sport because of the difficulties compared to simply putting holes in paper.

The reliance on properly published data is very good advice. Some of the people putting loads information on the Internet are way out of line. There is

another point, however, even among the "professionals". There is a wide difference of opinion on loads among the equipment manufacturers. Lee, for example, is way on the end toward safety while Lyman is on the end toward performance. Richard Lee, in the Modern Reloading book does not recommend the use of any magnum primers yet the data shown for the .357 Magnum taken from Hodgdon and others was determined with magnum primers. If

you want an extreme example of how the professional advice can vary, here are a few. These came to my attention because I recently purchased a Henry Big Boy .44 to go with my Ruger .44 Magnum Super Blackhawk.

For a 200 grain lead bullet, Lee gives a starting load of 6.2 grains of IMR4756 and a maximum of 7.0. The maximum value also agrees with IMR data for a Cast LRNFP. For the same 200 grain lead bullet (Cast LP), Lyman gives a starting IMR 4756 load of 12.3 grains and a maximum of 15.5! These differ not by a few grains, but by a factor of 2. A similar situation exists for IMR 800-X, where Lee gives the starting load as 5.2 grains and the maximum as 5.9 while Lyman gives 12.0 and 15.1 grains respectively.

I have over 50 years behind me with this stuff, but I think we must admit that to a newcomer the above professional sources will cause great confusion. The Lee loads give velocities in the 700 fps range while the Lyman loads are in the 1100 to 1200 fps range. The Lee Power Factors are 145-162 while the Lyman are 196 to 268. It appears those powders work over a very wide range for this weight of bullet. The Lyman loads are definitely the more useful for IHMSA. The Lee loads might scare one off using those powders.

Mr. Horowitz also mentions in the article the "high pressure with low load" phenomena. I desperately tried, with no success, to find the reference that I have among my books. But I distinctly recall that a Department of Defense Laboratory did testing and was able to reproduce the phenomena if you loaded the 2.7 grains of Bullseye many times in enough cartridges. It does happen, as cataloged by some of the more "famous" folks like Ackley. As Ken pointed out, most times it is double charge but not always.

I happen to be interested in such stuff

as I am a Ph.D. Physical Chemist which is why I recall it, and the science underpinning this kind of thing is well known. We all know that if I tap the cartridge on the base before I put it in the gun and fire it I will get a much higher velocity than if I tap it on the nose and fire it. The distance to the primer matters.

Now suppose, for the sake of explanation, I put half the powder next to the primer and the other half next to the bullet. They ignite at separate times and create separate pressure waves. Pressure waves, if the powders were compact enough, behave like "solitons". A soliton is a wave that is somewhat like a "particle" because it keeps its shape and amplitude. These two waves in the confined space of the cartridge are headed in opposite directions. They reinforce somewhere between the two points and the pressure spike becomes real. This has been demonstrated with water many times and you may know the effect in plumbing by the term "water hammer". Usually this is caused by someone shutting off a valve abruptly and creating back flow waves which then hit water heading in the direction toward the valve. It can burst pipes. Apparently the similar phenomena, although rare because you have to have the powder in just the right place, can burst cartridges.

Because this effect can be reproduced to a certain extent if you try over and over again, I am of the opinion that there is a very small but real risk to low loads in big cases. This may be emphasized if one uses magnum primers with a low load.

I generally get as much data for a given powder from all reliable sources and put it in a table. Many of us do this I am sure so one can see the anomalies. Since they are all "good" and "professional" sources they are not "right" or "wrong", but simply cover a wide range of purpose.

I have been a life member for 30-plus years and have enjoyed the sport of shooting steel for a long time. It is my hobby along with other aspects of shooting, reloading, and tinkering. I will soon be 72 and my eyes are not what they were, but thanks for this new class Practical Hunter, I have a new lease on the sport. I would not have ever guessed how difficult this game is shooting with a scope on a production gun. That is difficult for me.

I understand times are tough so what I am going to do is send membership dues at \$50 plus the \$20 for the *IHMSA News* (I do not do computers!!!) and I will do this

every year for as long as I can lay down and hold that gun and be able to get up again.

Maybe I should make this a challenge to other life members. I have been truly blessed and this outlay of extra cash won't hurt. Besides this is a sport I truly love so I must support it.

MARKSMANSHIP COMPETITIONS

The Burris Cup:

Scoped .22 Long Rifle caliber handguns only. Your best 5-shot group at 100 yards or meters. Guns may be bench rested over any solid rest as long as the gun is not in a Ransom Rest, vise, or any other mechanical clamping device. Lying on your back in a freestyle position and piling sandbags by your body for support is legal. This will allow scoped guns set up for creedmoor to better compete.

The Weaver Trophy:

Scoped centerfire handguns. Your best 5-shot group at 100 yards or meters. Guns may be bench rested over any solid rest as long as the gun is not in a Ransom Rest, vise, or any other mechanical clamping device. Lying on your back in freestyle position and piling sandbags by your body for support is legal. This will allow scoped guns set up for creedmoor to better compete.

The Merit Challenge:

Centerfire handguns with iron / open sights. Your best 5-shot group at 100 yards or

meters. Groups must be fired from an IHMSA legal freestyle position. No benchrest or artificial support allowed.

The Daisy Avanti Trophy:

AIR Production guns with Iron/Open sights. Your best 5-shot group at 18 yards. Groups must be fired from an IHMSA legal freestyle position. No benchrest or artificial support allowed.

General Rules: All entries must be shot with IHMSA legal guns. Production, Revolver, and Unlimited guns are allowed in the Burris, Weaver, and Merit classes.

Witness: Winning groups must be witnesses by an IHMSA or NRA member. Eligible winning targets must be signed and dated by the shooter and witness. Also, please include the shooter's IHMSA number and the witness's IHMSA or NRA number by their name. A witness is not required to enter but is required to win.

Targets: Targets submitted must contain no more and no less than 5 shots in each bull zone.

Marksmanship Program

Bob Smith of Aurora, CO is on the board! Bob is the revolver guru of Region 8, and is one of the top all-around shooters in that region.

Bob turned in a .697" target that he shot with a 14" scoped Contender in .223, using IMR 3031 and 50 grain Hornady bullets. I thought that was pretty good shooting by Bob.

Well, that didn't last long. A couple of days later, there was another submission in my mailbox from Bob. This time it was an XP-100 chambered in .22-250, with a combination of IHR 3031 and 55 grain Hornady's. I don't recall exactly what I said when I opened the envelope, but I do remember hearing my daughter in the other room say, "Dad! Language!" This 5-shot target measured in at .471". Not to be a woulda-coulda-shoulda type, but 4 of those shots were at .278! Congratulations Bob, this is excellent shooting.

Competition bullet. It's a work in progress...

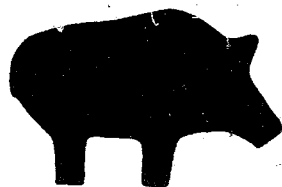

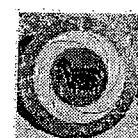

Match Publication Policy

As we continually have new match directors, following is the IHMSA News' policy on publication of state, regional, and "specialty" match notices and match results.

Any IHMSA sanctioned club in good standing may publish a notice of their club's state or regional championship match at no charge for three months. State match notices are limited to 2 1/4 "x5". Regional match notices are limited to 4 3/4 "x5". If a club is holding a "specialty" match and that match does not replace one of these championships, the *IHMSA News* will publish a 2 1/4 "x5" notice at no charge one time. These notices will run in Section B only. The club may publish additional notices of the same size for \$45 per issue. Ads must be prepaid before printing. All payments are to be sent to IHMSA HQ, P.O. Box 22356, Cheyenne, WY 82003. The club may specify whether the paid notice is published in Section A or B.

State match results can list both first and second place finishes. Regional match results can list first, second, and third place finishes. "Specialty" matches replacing a state championship may publish first and second place finishes. "Specialty" matches replacing a regional championship may publish first, second, and third place finishes. All other match results wherein the total number of handgun silhouette entries exceeds 11 (including all IHMSA, NRA & non-member guests) can list only the first place finish. Matches with less than 11 total handgun entries as defined above can list all IHMSA handgun entrants and their place. Regardless of the above, all 40's, 60's, and 80's (depending on the number of rounds fired at the match) can be published from ANY IHMSA match.

An IHMSA club holding a dual sanctioned (IHMSA/NRA) match may submit a match report for publication in the *IHMSA News* containing both IHMSA and NRA results. The number of published NRA results may not exceed the number of published IHMSA results. **Publication is limited to IHMSA sanctioned handgun disciplines only.**

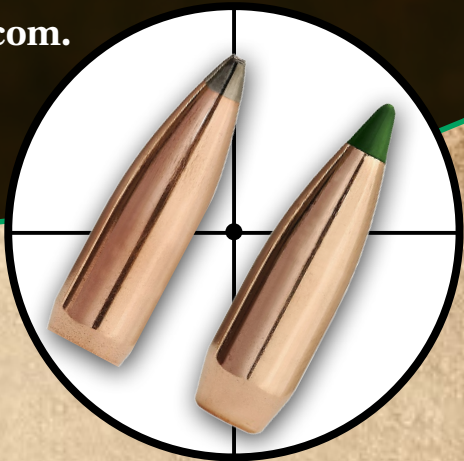

The SHOT Show is simply too large to comprehend it unless you are there. 67,000 people from over 100 countries flooded Las Vegas this past January, a record attendance. Physically, it consumes virtually all of the Sands Expo Center spilling over into the Venetian, and you will walk over 12 miles if you walk down every aisle. Trust me, you will walk much farther than that, because you double back a lot even with a substantial amount of strategic planning. The SHOT Show app is invaluable in keeping you organized and on track. There were over 1,600 exhibiting companies consuming 635,000 square feet of floor space.

No question the SHOT Show is about guns – all kinds of guns from black powder to machine guns mounted on SWAT type vehicles and everything in between. You can drool over spendy guns (how about a 1911 starting at \$5,750 and going up from there?) or inexpensive guns. You have your choice of black powder, no powder (air guns) or smokeless powder firearms. Then there are the accessories - clothing, reloading equipment, reloading components, ammunition, tactical and police equipment and even cases for your iPhone or iPad. Then there is a plethora of hunting equipment, ATV's, tree stands, blinds, calls, decoys, and even equipment to cook that game on or in, plus seasonings to make everything yummy. And I doubt that I have mentioned all the types of goodies you would want to add to your wish list. Last but not least by any means is getting to see old friends such as Carroll from Sierra Bullets, Pat from Leupold, and Bob and his dad at Freedom Arms. The bottom line is that it is impossible to see everything; so, you need to pick & choose your interests and plan carefully. Then, you will get sidetracked because you'll walk by a booth with things that peak your interest and you'll spend time exploring. But, heck, that's half the fun of SHOT!

SHOT Show – A Review

Informative were put on by the National Shooting Sports Foundation (owner of the show) and Howard Leight by Honeywell, manufacturer of hearing protection.

The NSSF presentation gave a state-by-state review of the economic impact of sport shooting. If you ever needed ammunition in a discussion with anti-gunners, being able to inform them of the value of the shooting sports to their particular state should get their attention. While they may not like guns, I bet they like money and jobs!

The Howard Leight seminar was presented by Lt. Col (Retired), USAF, Theresa Y. Schulz, Audiologist and Hearing Conservationist. She explained the compounding of repeated noise on hearing loss and demonstrated the proper method of inserting soft, disposable ear plugs. Theresa explained that the majority of people do not insert them correctly. Step one is to roll them as thin as possible making sure there are no wrinkles in them. Why no wrinkles? She rolled one with wrinkles and inserted it into a funnel then poured in water. It leaked. When repeated without wrinkles, no leaks. Step two is to reach over your head with the hand opposite the ear you are inserting the plug into. The key here is to grab and pull your ear at the right place to open the ear canal. Most of us grab the top of the ear, wrong place. Instead grab slightly behind the top. As Theresa explained, grab your ear like your mother did when she pulled you by the ear. Step three—insert the rolled plug down into the ear canal holding it until it expands. To check if you did it right, look straight on into a mirror. You should not see the plug.

The disposable ear plug is a critical part of protecting your hearing. Properly inserted, Howard Leight plugs have a noise reduction rating of 30. This is substantially greater than most muffs. However, the best protection is plugs and muffs. The issue I have

(with a hearing disability) is being able to hear with both plugs and muffs. However, that has been solved nicely. After the seminar, a drawing was held for 3 pair of Impact Sport electronic muffs, and I won a pair. I have been using plugs and muffs at matches since January, and this system works exceptionally well. Noise is reduced to a much more comfortable level yet I can hear range commands and conversations. Plus the Impact Sport muffs are very thin and



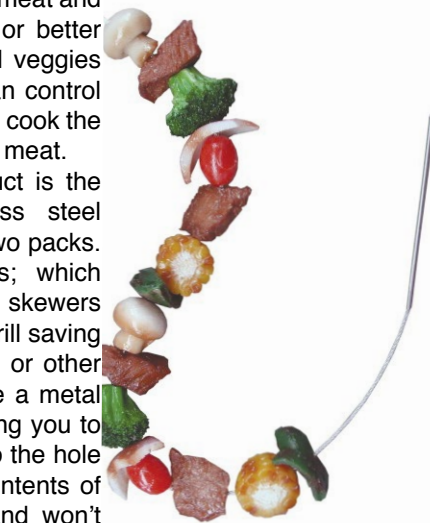
are not in the road when shooting in the Creedmoor position. Please consider making this investment to protect your hearing!

Three products I really like involve food preparation. I am a barbecue fanatic and enjoy great kabobs. However, I have yet to find skewers that work well. Generally speaking, veggies tend to fall off or the skewers take up too much room on the grill. FireWire has two great products out that eliminate these problems. The first one is their double prong stainless steel skewer. These neat guys come in four packs; which allow you to create individual kabobs with meat and veggies for each person or better yet, put meat on two and veggies on two. That way you can control the cook time and not over cook the veggies or under cook the meat.

The second product is the FireWire flexible stainless steel skewer. These come in two packs. They are flexible cables; which allow you to wrap the skewers around the edge of your grill saving the middle to cook meats or other items. The skewers have a metal tab with a hole in it allowing you to thread the needle end into the hole making a circle so the contents of the skewer are secure and won't fall off.

The final cooking product I have been using is Seth McGinn's CanCooker. Being single, I bought the Junior model, and it is certainly large enough to feed at least 4 people. The easiest way to describe the CanCooker is that it is a low tech steamer. You can cook a whole meal of meats and vegetables in less than an hour. It works great when you don't have 7 or 8 hours to wait on your slow cooker. The one caveat I will give is to not use softer vegetables such as broccoli. Stick with potatoes, carrots, onions and other similar vegetables. The softer ones tend to not hold up well. An advantage of the CanCooker is that it can be used with any heat source, and I will be taking it camping.

Hopefully, this gives you an idea of the variety of products on display at the SHOT Show. It is without a doubt a shooter's/outdoor person's hog heaven!

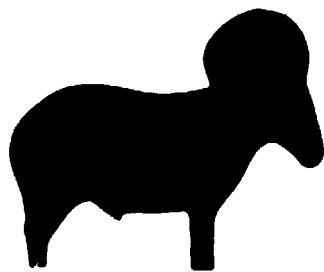
