Legends of Silhouette #5 David Bradshaw by The Old Guy

Like each of the four previous shooters I have told about in earlier columns, David Bradshaw has a number of really impressive achievements to his credit, but unlike the others already profiled, all of today's IHMSA shooters owe a major debt of gratitude to David Bradshaw. I want to mention the reason for that first.

David joined IHMSA in 1977 and has membership number 547. He was active in the very early administration of IHMSA as the head of the Safety Committee. It was he who convinced the late Elgin Gates who was then President of IHMSA that we needed a rule that required all shooters to wear eye and ear protection when taking part in IHMSA matches. Now more than thirty-five years later it is assumed that such a rule is very important, perfectly reasonable and logical, but older shooters can remember a time when such a rule was considered an imposition on the freedom of shooters. It is hard to imagine this today, but back then a lot of old timers resisted this rule. It was different from how it always had been, and old timers are very reluctant to accept new things, changes in the way things always have been. Those old timers who are still around today are all at least partially deaf, and whatever hearing they have left is thanks to David Bradshaw who convinced the Board of Directors to put through the rule requiring eye and ear protection. Today's younger shooters have no such problems also thanks to David's initiation of this rule. And this is not just about ear protection. I personally know of at least two catastrophic gun failures at IHMSA matches where someone would have been blinded if they had not been wearing eye protection. Thank you, David.

David Bradshaw was primarily but not exclusively interested in revolvers, Rugers, Dan Wessons, Smith & Wessons, Colts. If it had a cylinder that turned, David wanted to try it and see how good it was. He lived in northern Vermont, and after he joined in 1977, he heard about the upcoming 1977 Internationals out west in Los Angeles. Participation required the entrant to have shot three times in each category he or she wanted to enter, so he drove up to Maine and shot his 7 1/2" Ruger Blackhawk in the roll over prone position popular at that time. He shot 28x40 and won the match. He got in his old 1964 Dodge Coronet with the Slant 6 engine and drove all the way across the country to Los Angeles where he met John Adams, Col. Jeff Cooper, and Ray Chapman among others.

At this time there was no separate Revolver category, and he had to compete against shooters using single shots that were more powerful and more accurate, but he began lobbying the Board of Directors to institute a separate Revolver category. After they did, in 1980 at the Internationals in Massachusetts (He did not have to drive 6,000 miles to participate in that one.) he won the Revolver category the first time it was offered. His score was 73x80. His load back then was a 240 grain Sierra over 21.0 grains of 2400 with Winchester brass and CCI 350 mag primers.

He continued to shoot this combination in local matches and started trying what I believe is one of the unusual things for which I believe he qualifies as one of the Legends of Silhouette. He shot all four categories with a revolver. In 1983 he did this using only a Ruger KS411N 10 1/2" Stainless Blackhawk .44 Mag with an untapered barrel and a screwed on front sight. He named it the Silver Hornpipe. He is the only person ever to shoot 140x160 four gun aggregate using only a revolver. He shot a 34x40 Standing en route to the 140. What makes this 140x160 even more impressive is that he did this in the old days with full foot rams that were very hard to knock over. Even with the 240 grain Sierra moving over 1,300 fps at the muzzle, he still had several ram bites, so he actually hit 142. If this was not enough, in 1984 shooting a Dan Wesson .357 Super Mag with an 8" barrel, he shot a 143x160. This was after a 28x40 Standing so his other scores had to have been a lot better than they were in 1980. His load here was a 200 grain Speer over 21 grains of IMR 4198 (That's right, IMR 4198. It is not what you might expect, but it worked.). This produced a muzzle velocity of 1250 fps. Again his actual hit count was 2 or 3 higher. He just lost them to ram bites. Remember this was long before the topple point rule. If someone complained, the official mantra was "Bigger bullets, more powder." At this time the four gun aggregate record with four different guns was only 146x160, so he was not far from that record.

There is something else David Bradshaw achieved that as far as I know he is the only one ever to accomplish. There are only a handful of IHMSA (or NRA shooters for that matter) who have gotten a Grand Slam Standing, but unlike all the others, David Bradshaw managed it with a revolver. For those of you who do not know what a Grand Slam is, it is having shot and knocked down ten in a row of each animal on different occasions. Think about it. He was able to stand up on his hind legs and shoot a revolver held out at arms length and was steady enough to run ten in a row of each animal including ten in a row of the turkeys. Furthermore it was a revolver with enough knockdown power and the accompanying recoil to take down ten full footed rams. That is quite an achievement.

Is it possible that his 34x40 Standing with a revolver also is a record? I wonder. Does anyone know of anyone who has beaten that?

Congratulations, David. You're one of the Legends of Silhouette.

2016 World Championship State and Regional 5-gun Team Competition

At this year's 40th annual World Championship we are going to offer a new free team competition. It is a mix of the Traditional 4-gun aggregate with the addition of the popular UAS category.

There will be separate Small Bore and Big Bore teams.

You may sign up on one State team and one Region team in both SB and BB. You must sign up your team in the club house before the first member of your team fires his team entry score. There can be multiple teams from the same State or Region but you may be on only one team. The teams will consist of a minimum of 2 competitors if both are seniors or a minimum of 3 with one senior. A senior may shoot a max of 3 entries for the team. A non-senior may shot a max of 2 entries for the team.

The total of 5 categories will be shot. The categories are Production, Revolver, Unlimited, Standing, and UAS. The total of the 5 categories will determine the winners of the team competitions.

THE NEW SILHOUETTER

Hodgdon 2016 Annual Manual

Once again, Hodgdon brings us this valuable and informative source for our reading and reloading pleasure. It is much more than a typical magalog highlighting a manufacturer's products. Each article can be a standalone feature in a quality publication and some are much more worthy than what I have found I some mainstream magazines. Add to that the reloading data including updates for 31 rifle and pistol cartridges and the \$8.99 newsstand price is a great bargain. For not much more than a run of the mill gun rag, you get a quality magazine plus the updated data.

Since the Annual Manual's inception, I've always been pleased with the breadth of the topics covered, some of which are ones of direct interest for the kind of shooting I do and others which I read even more intently since I enjoy learning about things that I don't do, sometimes even more so. Take for example the article on Elk loads by John Taffin. I don't hunt elk (in fact, I don't hunt at all), and the .454 Casull is too much gun for me. Nevertheless, I sat glued to this article, immediately captured by Taffin's homespun style and buildup to the main purpose of the article in building a favorite handload for the 454.

Loading the 300 Blackout, an article by Patrick Sweeney also fascinated me. I have no interest acquiring a firearm in 300 Blackout or its predecessor, the 300 Whisper. Further, the likelihood of suppressors ever becoming legal in my home state is slimmer than the side view of a piece of paper. It is also a mystery to me as to why satisfactory results could not have been more effectively developed with recipes for the 30 TCU, now about 35 years old. Despite all these "howevers," or perhaps because of them, I've been keeping track on much of the 300 Blackout hype out there and this article adds new perspective.

One thing I don't need is a new hobby and to date I've been successful at ducking black powder. However, I am always interested in history and physical sciences and the article on Olde Eynsford for Black Powder Cartridges by Ross Seyfried has both of these elements. His touches on regulation of double barrels is something that needs to see ink more often. While the article addresses rifles, I've most often encountered errors by armchair gun philosophers on double barreled shotguns, where adamancy and loud voices trump facts. I appreciate the facts. Also new to me was how highly developed black powder was "back in the days." Until I read the article I had never given much thought as to carbon being the wildcard of quality but now understand why it was. As an afficionado of pre-circuit board mechanics, the descriptions of the two rifles used in the article took me over the top.

Just when you might think that all that can be written about a cartridge well into its second century has already been written, An All-Around 30-06 Load by John Barsness dispels that. To date, the only 30-06 loads I've ever loaded have been for my M-1 Garand for use in High Power and CMP matches. Loads suitable for the Garand are limited to those that create enough gas pressure to cycle the action without damaging the operating rod. (Because of their unique shape, these operating rods are seldom repairable if damaged, getting pretty pricey and even worse, becoming short in supply.) So why would I be interested in the 165 grain bullet recipes loaded with IMR 4350 and H4350? Enter coincidence.

Somewhere along the line, I've accumulated a few hundred various factory rounds of 30-06 cartridges that are unsuitable for my M-1 Garand. Usually I just give ammunition that I don't use to friends that can use it but for some reason I've accumulated these over the years. Just weeks before I received the 2016 Annual Manual, I decided the best way to address these rounds was to send them downrange so I ordered a 30-06 barrel for my T/C Encore. It's a 24"

stainless barrel and I'm still thinking about which scope to mount on it. Now that I can fire any 30-06 load, I'm looking forward to using some of Barsness' recipes. I already have plenty of brass and some 165 grain bullets; all I need to get are a few pounds of 4350 and/or H4350.

Handloading the 223 Remington for ARs and Bolt Actions addressed the more usual approach than the one I used. In Lane Pearce's opening he states the article is intended for those who have been handloading for bolt action rifles and now are seeking to load for AR semi-autos. My relationship with the 223 Remington and 5.56mm NATO started with loads for the Ruger Mini-14 followed by my Bushmaster CMP Competition AR-15, which had been sanitized such that it met ownership requirements in my home state. It was quite a while afterwards that I loaded any 223 Remington for a TC Encore barrel.

Since I already had been loading for the requirements of AR cycling, the obstacles correctly noted in the article are inapplicable to me; I am going in the opposite direction. Even so, or perhaps especially so, the pressure differences between the SAAMI 223 Remington and its NATO cousin are exceptionally important and any reloader assembling cartridges for both firearm types would be well advised to become familiar with the differences.

New Trends for the 45 ACP by Charles Petty also tweaked my interest in an oddball way. I load quite a bit for this chambering but unlike the emphasis on the venerable Model 1911, I hurl my .451 bullets through a S&W Model 625 wheel gun. When I first got into handgunning of any type I couldn't get myself to like the 1911although I have nothing against it and have shot several over the years. In quite unorthodox fashion, I adopted the round before I bought any gun chambered for it. Before any hate mail floods me, note that I have nothing against the 1911; I just prefer revolvers to semiautomatics. That said, I probably will break down some day and buy a 1911, although if I can get my hands on one in 38 Super, I may go that way. Several years ago, I shot a Colt Gold Cup chambered for the 38 Super and it has remained the most accurate 1911 I ever fired. I don't know if it is mostly because of the chambering or that it was a Gold Cup but the accuracy sticks in my mind.

Back to the article, it gave me considerable new load data and I was especially pleased for all it had on 185 grain bullets. My most accurate loads for my Model 625 come from 185 grain bullets including the Hornady 185 grain HAP. Within the Petty article's numerous loads, there are quite a few based on 185 grain bullets, including a dozen based on Hornady's 185 grain XTP. According to Hornady, its HAP bullets are modeled after the XTP bullet design, further refined into the perfect competition projectile. My experience with the 185 grain HAP has been great and I welcome these new loads from the article.

Reloading the 28 Nosler was interesting. Although pretty good money could be bet that I will never reload this cartridge (as you know, I don't hunt and I don't like recoil), I learned a lot. I'm still pondering why the 28 Nosler is so much easier to reload than the 26 Nosler. Also, the comparative gains/losses in velocity using a longer 26" barrel in the article than 24" test barrel used for Hodgdon's load development re-emphasizes how we Should follow reliable recipes and limit experimentation at the bench. Predictions and expectations are not always followed by results. Why some velocities increased while others decreased once again shows that reloading is not a 5decimal place accurate science.

I used to save every shooting magazine until I decided to stop the clutter, pass them on to others or the recycling bin. While that process went into effect decades ago, I still hang on to the Annual Manual, at least until the next issue publishes. After all, when I'm through reading the articles, the reloading data follows. Even in this day of digital data, I work with paper at the bench and that's where the Manual resides until it is replaced by a newer issue.

Overall, the 2016 Annual Manual is a pleasure to read and chock full of great info. Most likely, if you pick up and go through a copy, you'll be back for the issues in 2017, 2018, 2019

The Burris cup:

Lying on your back in a freestyle position and piling sandbags by your body for support is legal. This will allow scoped guns setup for Creedmoor to better compete.

The Weaver Trophy:

Scoped centerfire handguns. Y our best 5-shot group at 100 yards or meters. Guns may be bench rested over any solid rest as long as the gun is not in a ransom rest, vise or any other mechanical clamping device. Lying on your back in a freestyle position and piling sandbags by your body for support is legal. This will allow scoped guns setup for Creedmoor to better compete.

The Merit Challenge:

Centerfire handguns with iron/open sights. Y our best 5-shot group at 100 Y ards or Meters. Groups must be fired from an IHMSA legal position. No benchrest or artificial support allowed.

The Daisy Avanti Trophy:

AIR production guns with iron/open sights. Your best 5-shot group at 18 Yards. Groups must be fired from an IHMSA legal position. No benchrest or artificial support allowed.

General Rules:

All entries must be shot with IHMSA legal guns. Production, Revolver, and Unlimited guns are allowed in the Burris, Weaver and Merit classes.

Witness:

Winning groups must be witnessed by an IHMSA or NRA member. Eligible winning targets must be signed and dated by the shooter and witness. Also, please include the shooters IHMSA number and the witness's IHMSA or NRA number by their name. A witness is not required to enter but is required to win.

Entries into the $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{1}{5}$ records program are a little sparse so far, but I expect lots more as the season becomes more "seasonal" in the spring and summer.


